Developers urged to embrace IoT technology

SHAH ALAM: Property developers in Malaysia have been urged to start embracing technologies, particularly the Internet of Things (IoT), to make their products more attractive for potential house buyers.

Science, Technology and Innovation Minister Datuk Seri Madius Tangau said the move to incorporate the technology of IoT would not only add value to the properties, but it was also a forward thinking effort.

He said added features, such as smart homes or home automation, would make the property more desirable for house buyers.

“The industry need to develop standards that can be emulated beyond the Malaysian market. The ministry’s IoT Development Eco-System can be leveraged via a collaborative platform for more accessible, newer and game-changing solutions.

“The (property) industry should explore the technologies that are created by the research agencies un-

der the ministry, such as Mimos and Sirim, and work with them to accelerate the implementation of local technologies.

“There is a very critical component in that, which is greener and cleaner technology. Malaysia has signed the COP21 Paris Climate Change agreement, where we have a commitment to achieve zero carbon emission by 2050. And we have to start from our lifestyle and houses.

“Developers should look at this from the marketing point of view. The new generation is coming up with new lifestyle and perhaps if you don’t embrace this new technology, you might have a lot of challenges to market your product.

Madius said this after witnessing the strategic partnership between Huawei Technologies (M) Sdn Bhd and I-Berhad to implement the Smart City and IoT-ready home concept. It was signed by I-Berhad deputy chairman Datuk Eu Hong Chew and Huawei chief marketing officer Lim Cheesiong.

CyberSecurity Malaysia Berkerjasama Dengan Scope International Peningkat Ekosistem Keselamatan Siber

BUKIT JALIL, 22 Sept (Bernama) -- CyberSecurity Malaysia, agensi di bawah **Kementerian Sains, Teknologi dan Inovasi**, menjalin kerjasama dengan Scope International Malaysia Bhd untuk memajukan ekosistem keselamatan siber negara.

Scope International adalah pusat perkhidmatan perkongsian global kumpulan perbankan multinasional, Standard Chartered Bank.

Kedua-dua pihak menandatangani memorandum persefahaman (MoU) bersetuju untuk melahirkan tenaga mahir keselamatan siber di negara ini melalui inisiatif di peringkat negara, risikan ancaman siber dan perkongsian pengetahuan forensik dan mendidik masyarakat berkenaan aspek keselamatan siber.

Melalui MoU tersebut, beliau berkata kedua-dua pihak akan membentuk kerjasama khusus, yang termasuk mengendalikan penyelidikan dan pembangunan, perkongsian maklumat dalam bidang forensik dan risikan ancaman keselamatan siber serta mengendalikan kempen kesedaran dan latihan berkaitan ancaman siber dan langkah-langkah perlu diambil agar siber selamat.

Madius berkata kedua-dua pihak juga akan bekerja sama membentuk generasi baru tenaga mahir siber melalui usaha sama dengan institusi pengajian tinggi.

"Ini adalah peluang yang hebat untuk tenaga mahir tempatan mempelajarinya daripada pakar bertaraf dunia.

"Mereka bukan sahaja mempelajari tentang kemahiran kejuruteraan tetapi juga

tentang budaya kerja, cara pemikiran, proses, dasar, prosedur dan semua amalan baik," tambah beliau.

Ketua Pegawai Eksekutif Scope International Matthew Norris berkata Standard Chartered melihat keselamatan maklumat dan siber sebagai keperluan utama untuk mencapai aspirasi digital dan menjadi perkara penting untuk memastikan perkhidmatan yang disediakan dikendalikan dalam keadaan yang selamat.
