"MS yang dibangunkan ini

Suruhanjaya Tenaga untuk



## Bodyguard to return to court on March 22

GEORGE TOWN — The bodyguard alleged to have fatally shot three people, including his "Datuk" employer, in Penang last December is set to return to court on March 22 for fuurther proceedings.

Ja'afar Halid, 38, was produced before Sessions judge Roslan Hamid yesterday morning to face attempted murder charges under Section 307 of the Penal Code.

He faces a maximum 20 years' jail for each charge upon conviction.

Ja'afar was alleged to have attempted to murder Dr Arivarni Krishnan, Nurul Huda Ab Aziz and Lee Hong Boon while armed with a Glock 19 pistol during a shooting incident between 7.15pm and 7.30pm along Tun Dr Lim Chong Eu Expressway on Dec 1. Dr Arivarni, 33, sustained a gunshot wound to the head, while Nurul, 38, was struck on the shoulder, and Lee, 32, on the left chest.

During yesterday's proceedings, deputy public prosecutor Nurul Huda Idris told the court a new date for proceedings was needed as the Chemistry Department and medical reports had yet to be received.

The accused was then escorted to another court to appear before judge Irwan Suibon to face attempted murder charges against Mohamad Amirul Amin Mohamed Amer, 28, who sustained a gunshot wound to the chest, and Puoh Bee Joo, 32, who was shot on the shoulder.

The two were shot during the same incident. Deputy public prosecutor Lim Saw Sim also told the court the prosecution was awaiting similar reports before they could proceed with their case.

No plea was recorded in both courtrooms.

After the judges fixed March 22 for the next court mention, Ja'afar was escorted to the central prison where he remains held without bail.

Ja'afar was first charged on Dec 14 but was ordered to undergo a one-month psychiatric evaluation at Hospital Bahagia in Tanjung Rambutan, Perak.

Last Friday, he was produced in court for allegedly murdering his employer, Datuk Ong Teik Kwong, 32, by shooting him in the back of the head during the incident on Dec 1. He also faces charges of murdering Choi Hon Ming, 32, by shooting him in the left chest, and M. Senthil, by shooting him in the chest.

Besides the murder charges, Ja'afar is accused of causing injury to Lim Boon Leng, 32, by striking him on the head with a pistol.

The cases were mentioned in separate magistrate's courts, which also fixed March 22 for document submission.
