Sarawak bakal hadapi hujan lebat

KUALA LUMPUR 7 Jan.

- Cuaca buruk yang membawa hujan lebat sehingga menyebabkan banjir di Terengganu, Pahang, Johor dan Sabah dijangka melanda Sarawak pada bila-bila masa.

Ketua Pengarah Jabatan Meteorologi, Alui Bahari berkata, penduduk di negeri itu diminta membuat persiapan awal dan peka dengan sebarang perubahan cuaca yang tidak menentu.

“Kita menjangka hujan lebat melanda Sarawak bulan ini. Selain persiapan awal sebagai langkah berjaga-jaga, kita minta semua rakyat Malaysia ambil perhatian dengan amaran-amaran yang dikeluarkan dari semasa ke semasa.

“Ia boleh didapati dengan mudah melalui aplikasi telefon pintar ‘myCuaca’ yang boleh dimuat turun secara percuma melalui Google Play Store dan App Store,” ujarnya ketika dihubungi *Utusan Malaysia* di sini hari ini.

Setakat pukul 5 petang ini, tiada sebarang amaran cuaca buruk yang dikeluarkan oleh pihaknya.

Dalam pada itu, beliau turut memaklumkan, setakat ini masih belum ada tanda-tanda akan berlaku pusingan ketiga musim tengkujuh.

“Untuk Februari dan Mac depan, ramalan awal mendapati cuaca dalam keadaan baik dan tiada trend hujan lebat,” katanya.

Amaran Waspada Banjir Di Sabah Ditamatkan

KUALA LUMPUR, 7 Jan (Bernama) -- Pusat Kawalan Bencana Negara (NDCC) hari ini menamatkan amaran cuaca waspada (peringkat kuning) untuk Sabah berikutan keadaan cuaca di negeri itu yang bertambah baik.

NDCC dalam kenyataan berkata **Jabatan Meteorologi Malaysia** juga meramalkan tiada jangkaan hujan lebat akan berlaku dalam tempoh terdekat di negeri itu.

"Amaran cuaca yang dikeluarkan pada 4 petang, 6 Jan dengan ini ditamatkan," katanya.

Bagaimanapun, NDCC menasihatkan semua pihak agar mengekalkan keadaan siap sedia sekiranya kemungkinan berlaku lagi hujan lebat berterusan yang boleh mengakibatkan banjir.

February to see less rainfall, says MetMalaysia

PETALING JAYA: Less rainfall is expected next month, which will be heralding the Chinese New Year.

Malaysian Meteorological Department (MetMalaysia) director-general Alui Bahari said no heavy continuous rain is expected that month.

Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia's Professor of Climatology and Oceanography Prof Fredolin Tangang has a similar expectation.

Climatologically, over the peninsula, especially on the east coast, the amount of rainfall in February is expected to be less compared to November, December and January.

"Overall, no unusual weather

event is forecast over Malaysia in February," he said.

As far as the north-east monsoon effect is concerned, the peninsula is unlikely to experience major extreme weather events, he added.

"However, for Sarawak and Sabah, a wet condition is still possible, especially with the La Nina effect continuing until March to April," he said.

Prof Fredolin added that the latest seasonal forecast provided by the Apec Climate Centre in Busan, South Korea, also indicated that Sabah is forecast to have above normal rainfall, with the likelihood between 50% and 60%.


