Trust the weatherman, not social media

PETALING JAYA: The Malaysian Meteorological Department (MetMalaysia) has dismissed talk on social media that monsoon winds from the Philippines are bringing heavy showers and causing a wet and cold spell in the country.

MetMalaysia director-general Alui Bahari has also dispelled viral news that the sudden drop in body temperature could lead to high fever.

"The department denies viral social media news that a change in the monsoon winds from the Philippines has brought heavy rain to the western part of the country, resulting in continuous cold weather.

"The viral news also advises Malaysians to wear warm clothing at night to avoid a drastic drop in body temperature, which could result in high fever," he said in a statement.

The fake news stated that 16 major towns would experience a plunge in temperatures to as low as 14.2°C for Kundasang, Sabah, and 17.3°C for Kuala Krai, Kelantan.

On Friday, Alui was quoted in *The Star* as saying that the cold weather was a usual phenomenon during the north-east monsoon period between November and March.

In the statement yesterday, Alui noted that the coldest temperature

was recorded in Mersing (Johor) and Kuala Pilah (Negri Sembilan) at 21°C while other areas dropped to about 22°C, usually in the early hours.

"The situation is expected to continue until Jan 14 as the sky will remain cloudy with continued rainfall and cold winds brought about by the north-easterly monsoon," he said.

The wet spell is expected to subside gradually although several areas, such as Pahang (Kuantan, Pekan, Rompin) and Johor (Segamat, Mersing, Kota Tinggi), will continue to see heavy rainfall.

Alui said the bad weather warning alert issued by the department on Thursday had been replaced by a standby weather warning alert for today.

Strong winds of about 60kph and waves of about 4.5m are expected to lash the east coast states of the peninsula, according to MetMalaysia.

The west of Peninsular Malaysia has been in the grip of a cold snap, with the Klang Valley experiencing the coldest weather in months, with temperatures dipping to 22°C.

Kuala Pilah was among the places that registered a low of 21°C since midnight, very much lower than the normal 31°C to 32°C.

Cameron Highlands recorded 15°C on Friday.

Low temperatures a treat for Kuala Pilah folk

KUALA PILAH: Kuala Pilah in Negeri Sembilan is known as one of hottest and driest areas in the country.

However, for the past three days, people here have been enjoying the cold due to continuous rain. Temperatures have plunged to as low as 21°C. Checks in the area yesterday showed it was drizzling, accompanied by a strong wind.

Teacher Mohd Afiza Abu Bakar, 39, said the phenomenon was unusual.

"We experienced cold weather in 2016. But at that time it was due to winds coming from China. This time, continuous rain con-

tributed to the cold weather. It's unusual," he said, adding that his family members had been wearing thick clothes to prevent muscle cramps.

"The weather is colder at night. We used to sleep with the air conditioner on. But, for the past three days, we slept without it and covered ourselves with blankets," he said.

Afiza's son, Muhamad Airiel Hakeem, 10, said he enjoyed the cold weather as it reminded him of Cameron Highlands.

"I love the cold weather and I wish it could stay like this."

State Meteorological Department director Mohammad

Redzuan Abdul Moin said the low temperature was due to continuous rain.

"It is normal for the temperature to plunge during and after rainy days. We experience the same phenomenon every year. The weather is expected to be warmer today (yesterday) and the rain is expected to subside soon."

Redzuan said the maximum temperature over the last seven days was recorded at 29°C, while the minimum temperature was 21°C.

He advised the public to monitor notices issued by the department for accurate information on the weather.

GENTING HIGHLANDS: With the thick fog and the mist curling from your breath, you would think that you are visiting Europe in winter.

"And since Chinese New Year is just around the corner, we are also doing some shopping," he said yesterday.

The Meteorological Department said this was due to the effects of the north-east monsoon – overcast sky, incessant rain and cold winds.

Police officer Mohd Farhan Jamion, 35, drove from Ipoh with his wife Suhanita Hussain, 32, and their seven-year-old son Muhammad Izz Ferriz.

"I really like the cold weather and we can finally use our winter jacket. However, my son kept complaining that it was too cold," he said.

Engineer Al-Firman Zahari, 34, from Johor, even brought along his extended family from Jakarta to experience the chilly weather.

"Now, we do not have to travel so far to get this kind of beautiful weather.

"Although we need to wear jackets, I think it is just nice for us to walk around. It looks like winter here, too," he said.

For M. Tharani, 22, who is studying at a university in Pahang, the weekend trip with her friends has been a stress reliever.

"We want to relieve our stress and the weather is really nice. We are going to check out the new restaurants," she said.

Housewife Siti Zaleha Abdullah, 53, from Taman Tun Dr Ismail, said the damp was making it harder for her to dry clothes outside.

"It's always rainy and cloudy. I need to ask my daughter to bring me to the laundry to dry our clothes," she said.

"This will add extra cost to the family's expense."

Fitness enthusiast Mohd Razif Abdul Karim, 29, said with the cold and rainy weather, it was harder for him to go jogging.

"Usually, I can jog in the park after work but now, it is slightly more troublesome," said the Petaling Jaya resident.

A self-service launderette in Section 17, Petaling Jaya, is enjoying brisk business, with many customers coming in to use the dryer.

C.K. Wong said he spent RM4.50 to dry his clothes for 23 minutes in the machine.

"Otherwise, there is a musty smell on my clothes in this type of weather," he said.

Kuala Pilah: Cuaca sejuk daripada biasa hingga mencecah 21 darjah Celsius direkodkan di daerah ini, mencetus fenomena baharu bagi penduduk yang mengakui tidak pernah merasai suasana sedemikian, sebelum ini.

Keadaan itu menyebabkan sebahagian mereka, terutama kanak-kanak berpakaian tebal pada waktu pagi dan malam.

Seorang guru, Mohd Afiza Abu Bakar, 39, berkata fenomena berkenaan agak luar biasa bagi penduduk di daerah berkenaan yang sudah biasa dengan cuaca panas.

"Cuaca sejuk memang pernah berlaku di daerah ini dua tahun lalu berpunca daripada tempas tiupan angin luruan disebabkan tekanan tinggi di China.

"Bagaimanapun, ketika itu suhu tidak sejuk seperti kali ini yang diikuti

hujan tanpa henti. Saya dan ahli keluarga memakai pakaian tebal dan menggunakan selimut ketika tidur," katanya ketika ditemui di rumahnya di Batu Kikir di sini, semalam.

Sementara itu, anak lelakinya, Muhamad Airiel Hakeem, 18, berkata suasana sejuk ketika ini membuatkan dia berasa seperti berada di Cameron Highlands.



KUALA PILAH - "Dah macam duduk di Korea atau Australia yang ada salji, tapi ini Pilah dan di sini hanya ditemani hujan sahaja".

Itu yang dikongsikan anak muda kelahiran Kuala Pilah, Mohamad Pahami Mohamad Tarmizi, 31, yang bertugas sebagai kelasi kapal dan kerap merantau ke negara-negara beriklim sejuk.

Menurutnya, ini kali pertama rumahnya yang terletak di Gunung Pasir mengalami cuaca sejuk seumpama itu.

"Rasa macam Pilah ni ada salji pula, cuaca sejuk betul," katanya lagi.

Menurutnya sudah lebih dua hari, daerah ini dilanda hujan yang berlarutan dari pagi sehinggalah ke malam.

"Hendak pegang air pun rasa 'bercinta' kerana air sangat sejuk," ujarinya berseloroh.

Katanya, kebiasaan keadaan berkabus di Kuala Pilah hanya berlaku pada waktu-waktu tertentu sahaja, tetapi tertentu sahaja.

Seorang lagi penduduk, Muhamad Khairy Shukor, 28, berkata, cuaca sejuk ini sedikit sebanyak mengganggu urusan harian.

"Cuaca ini juga memberi impak kepada pengguna jalan raya terutama penunggang motosikal yang perlu melalui jalan basah, licin dan berlopak gara-gara hujan berpanjangan," katanya.

Tetap teruskan aktiviti



Sebelum ini, **Jabatan Meteorologi Malaysia** mengesahkan beberapa kawasan terutama di selatan Semenanjung mengalami penurunan suhu dengan Kuala Pilah di Negeri Sembilan merekodkan suhu paling rendah pada 21 darjah Celcius.

Ketua Pengarahnya Alui Bahari berkata bagaimanapun keadaan itu adalah fenomena biasa ketika musim monsun timur laut.

Namun, Jabatan Meteorologi Malaysia menafikan tular berhubung suhu terendah dialami negara yang disebarkan menerusi media sosial.

Menurut jabatan itu, suhu minimum yang direkodkan adalah normal iaitu sekitar 23 darjah Celsius yang lazimnya berlaku pada waktu subuh.

Banjir dijangka pulih dalam tempoh terdekat

PUTRAJAYA: Banjir yang melanda Pahang dan Johor ketika ini dijangka pulih sepenuhnya dalam tempoh terdekat berdasarkan perkiraan keadaan awan yang dikeluarkan **Jabatan Meteorologi Malaysia (MetMalaysia)**.

Ketua Pengarah Jabatan Pengairan dan Saliran, Datuk Ir Dr Md Nasir Md Noh, berkata berdasarkan keadaan semasa, awan tebal akan menurunkan hujan lebat yang menyebabkan banjir di beberapa negeri.

"Dalam minggu depan, kita jangkakan hujan lebat kerana masih ada awan tebal dan kita berharap penduduk sentiasa berjaga-jaga serta patuh kepada arahan keselamatan.

"Namun keadaan yang berlaku ketika ini juga adalah ketentuan Allah SWT, dan kita sebagai manusia hanya boleh meramalkan sahaja," katanya ketika ditemui media selepas program Nature Fun Ride 2018 yang dirasmikan oleh Timbalan Menteri Sumber Asli dan Alam Sekitar, Datuk Ir Dr Hamim Samuri di sini, hari ini.

Dalam perkembangan lain, Md Nasir berkata, pembinaan Rancangan Tebatan Banjir (RTB) Bandar Pekan, Parcel 1 di Pahang kini sudah 70 peratus siap.

"Bagi daerah Rompin, RTB masih lagi dalam perbincangan dan dijangka akan dimulakan pada tahun depan.

"Pembinaan RTB ini akan dapat mengelakkan kejadian banjir terutama di kawasan yang rendah, termasuk berhampiran dengan Sungai Pahang," katanya.

Suhu sejuk tidak jejas persekolahan di Kedah

Rata-rata pelajar mengenakan baju sejuk bagi memanaskan badan kerana tidak biasa dengan suhu dingin.

Malah ada di antara pelajar terpaksa mandi air panas kerana tidak tahan dengan air paip yang sejuk.

Menurut pelajar Fatin Aiman Ismail, 17 tahun, cuaca agak sejuk dan berkabus sejak kebelakangan ini membuatkan dia terpaksa bangun awal untuk menjerang air mandian.

“Sejuklah dengan kabus lagi, ada macam rasa malas bangun sebab sejuk. Kalau hari cuti boleh sambung tidur, hari sekolah sejuk tak bolehlah nak sambung tidur,” kata Fatin.

Bagi Addy Arman Ghazali, 14 tahun, mandian air panas sudah menjadi rutin buatnya sejak fenomena cuaca yang berlaku kebelakangan ini.

“Rasa lain sikit sebab sejuk. Kalau sebelum ini, datang sekolah taklah sejuk sangat macam ini. Terpaksalah mandi air panas sebab sejuk sangat,” kata Addy Arman.

Bagaimanapun, menurut Pengarah Pendidikan Kedah, Datuk Azuyah Hassan, jumlah kehadiran ke sekolah pada pagi ini adalah seperti biasa kerana hampir 97 peratus pelajar hadir ke sekolah.

Namun, pihak JPN menasihati ibu bapa dan pelajar agar menjaga kesihatan masing-masing ekoran perubahan mendadak suhu ini dibimbangi akan mengakibatkan pelbagai penyakit seperti demam dan asma.

Sementara itu, **Jabatan Meteorologi Malaysia** memaklumkan keadaan ini berlaku berikutan cuaca mendung, hujan dan pergerakan angin sejuk monsun timur laut yang dijangka berterusan sehingga esok.

Orang ramai juga dinasihatkan supaya memakai baju tebal pada sebelah malam bagi mengelakkan suhu badan turun secara mendadak dan seterusnya membawa kepada demam panas.



Penduduk Kuala Pilah Alami Sejuk Luar Biasa



KUALA PILAH, 13 Jan (Bernama) -- Penurunan suhu dengan Kuala Pilah di Negeri Sembilan merekodkan suhu paling rendah iaitu 21 darjah Celcius, menjadi fenomena luar biasa bagi penduduk dikawasan itu meskipun sebelum ini mereka sudah terbiasa dengan cuaca sejuk berbanding kawasan lain.

Seorang suri rumah Norizan Mahadi, 58, yang menetap di Taman Seri Ulu Bendul, Kuala Pilah sejak 17 tahun lalu berkata keadaan sejuk di kawasan ini bukanlah sesuatu yang pelik memandangkan kediamannya berdekatan dengan gunung, namun fenomema sejuk yang berlaku sejak empat hari lepas, ternyata agak luar biasa.

"Cuaca sejuk sejak empat hari lepas merupakan pengalaman pertama sejak saya menetap di sini sehingga tidak perlu memasang kipas di siang hari.

"Ketika waktu malam pula, suhu lebih sejuk berbanding waktu siang dan dinginnya terasa seakan berada di dalam peti ais," katanya kepada Bernama di sini, hari ini.

Sementara itu, pemandu teksi Md Tahir Md Derus, 46, berkata keadaan berkabus di sekitar kawasan Kuala Pilah pada kali ini adalah luar biasa apabila bukan bersifat sementara sebaliknya kabus sepanjang masa.

"Kawasan ini sentiasa diselubungi kabus pada masa-masa tertentu, tetapi sejak beberapa hari kebelakangan ini kabus sentiasa ada sehingga mengaburi jalan raya dan menyukarkan pemanduan," katanya.

Katanya suhu sejuk seperti ini juga jika berpanjangan dikhuatiri akan menjejaskan kesihatan, justeru bagi mengelakkan demam, selsema dan sebagainya, penduduk dilihat mula memakai pakaian sejuk untuk memastikan suhu badan mereka kekal panas.

Tinjauan Bernama di Kuala Pilah mendapati cuaca mendung dan dingin sejak awal pagi tadi serta berkabus.

Jabatan Meteorologi Malaysia sebelum ini mengesahkan beberapa kawasan terutamanya di selatan Semenanjung mengalami penurunan suhu dengan Kuala Pilah di Negeri Sembilan merekodkan suhu paling rendah pada 21 darjah Celcius sejak tengah malam kelmarin hingga awal pagi semalam.
