Gauging radiation levels digitally

Public can scan barcodes pasted on cell towers

MELAKA will be the pioneer to debut a digital platform for the public to gauge radiation levels from telecommunication towers through their smartphones.

Melaka Communications, Multimedia, Youth and Sports Development Committee chairman Kerk Chee Yee said the state-owned Melaka ICT Holding Sdn Bhd (MITCH), through the cooperation of National Nuclear Agency, developed a website for people to evaluate the emission levels at each tower in the state by scanning QR codes.

The barcodes will be pasted on the poles of the telecommunication towers and online.

"The state government is committed to ensuring the towers are safe from emission exposure and uses a digital barometer."

"Telecommunication towers emit non-ionising radio frequency radiation while ionising radiation from sources such as X-ray machines pose a health risk," said Kerk after hosting an official visit by Perak Communications, Multimedia, Non-Governmental Organisation and Cooperatives Development Committee chairman Hasnul Zulkarnain Abd Munaim.

Kerk said the state government faced complaints from residents about radiation from telecommunication towers in their homes.

"They can start scanning towers that already have QR codes and see for themselves the radiation levels on each tower," he said.

Kerk said there were 452 telecommuni-

cation towers in the state whereby 220 were owned by MITCH.

He said it would take 18 months to incorporate the QR codes on all the towers, including those managed by telecommunication companies.

Kerk added that the state government maintained stringent regulations on approving new structures and maintenance of the present towers.

Melaka had almost 99% cellular network coverage and efforts were under way to work closely with telecommunication companies to improve broadband services.

Hasnul Zulkarnain said he was impressed with MITCH's drive to improve the telecommunication infrastructures in Melaka and the mechanism employed by the agency to generate revenue for the state.

"This is my maiden visit to the state, and I will recommend a similar agency in Perak to work closely with Melaka to emulate their business model," he added.

Work together to minimise destruction

THE only reason we are safe from a tsunami is that there is no tsunami. This aphorism may sound funny but we expect nothing less from the multimillion-dollar systems that are supposed to protect us from harm in case of a tsunami. We really hope so.

Heart-rending news have been pouring in since Friday of the terrible tsunami on the west coast of Sulawesi after a magnitude 7.5 earthquake. A tsunami warning had been triggered but it miscalculated the extent of the phenomenon and was lifted slightly early, to the point that hundreds of Indonesians expressed their anger at the alert failure. Most of them think it can be improved.

The Indonesian authorities must have known about the tsunami risk but somehow it seems the alert was not done properly.

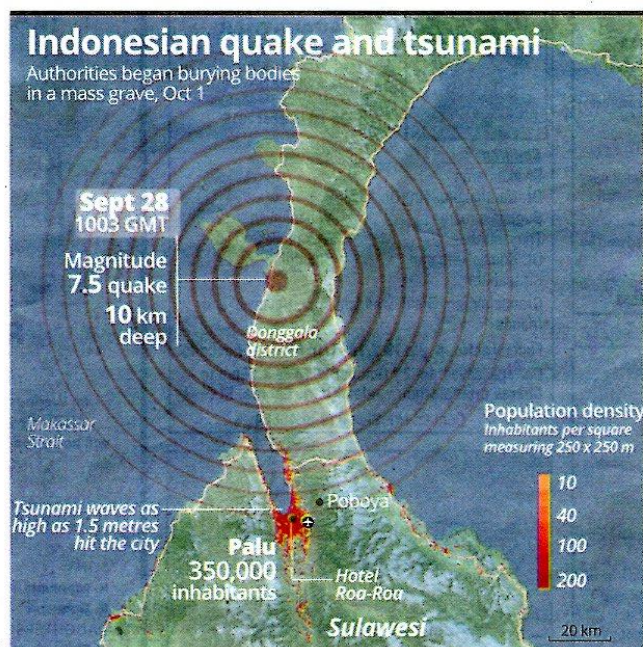
An announcement was made at 5.02pm (local time) by the Meteorology, Climatology and Geophysics Agency (Badan Meteorologi, Klimatologi dan Geofisika or BMKG) giving details of a tsunami, with waves of up to 3m, warning. Some received text messages warning them of the possibility of flooding.

This alert was then lifted at 6.36pm and was widely relayed by the media worldwide.

More than three hours later, a video of a tsunami hitting Palu, capital of the province of Central Sulawesi, went viral and the authorities officially confirmed that a tsunami had hit the coast.

The gap between the announcements of the lifting of the alert and the onset of the tsunami created confusion, with several news agencies announcing that the tsunami struck after the alert was lifted.

Given the proximity of Palu to the epicentre, it is likely that the tsunami had indeed hit the coast

30 minutes after the earthquake. According to the authorities, the tsunami landed at 6.22pm. From here, it is hard to tell what went wrong but in the video, it can be seen that the beach was crowded a few seconds before the tsunami hit, and no siren was heard in the background.

Geologists would have known the impact of the waves generated by the movement of the tectonic plates, which is pretty common in Indonesia. A buoy that alerts for changes in sea levels located 200km away from Palu only registered an insignificant 6cm wave and completely missed the giant

wave heading for Palu. Another report showed that there was a separate system with an advanced detection method, which might have been a life saver, but it was not installed due to insufficient funds (US\$69,000).

These "failures" are surprising for a nation that is an archipelago of 17,000 islands and islets formed by the merging of three large tectonic plates that are well known for their high seismic activity.

It is pointless to blame any party but we all need to learn the right lesson, which is that all neighbouring countries should proactively remind and help each other

because anything can happen in these circumstances. Meanwhile, our heart goes to all the victims and their families.

A TWO-DAY robotics challenge organised recently by the Faculty of Engineering & Technology (FET) students of Multimedia University (MMU) gave a taste of what it would be like to take up Robotics and Automation at the university.

The Robotics Challenge 2018 (MMURC 2018) saw SMK Katholik, Melaka emerge as champion of Category A (Forms 1 to 3), and first runner-up, SM Gajah Berang.

For Category B (Forms 4 to 6) both the champion and first runner-up were teams from Sekolah Berasrama Penuh Integrasi Selangor.

A total of 34 teams from 22 secondary schools from all over Melaka participated in the competition, with each team

comprising between two and four student competitors and one teacher advisor.

Each team is required to build its own robot, which is then tasked with circumnavigating a maze.

The MMURC 2018 was organised by FET, which also offers a Bachelor of Engineering Electronics degree, majoring in Robotics and Automation. The programme was funded by MMU National Marketing & Enrolment department.

MMU president Professor Datuk Dr Ahmad Rafi Mohamed Eshaq said the event was significant on many levels, considering that one of its main purposes was to expose and promote science and engineering creativity, especially among secondary school students.

"In the current workplace and market, technology is playing an increasingly larger role, and we wanted students to get a first-hand

feel of science and engineering.

"We wanted these students to understand that, even if they did not win this competition, giving students confidence was crucial," he said, since many students avoided the technical fields because they heard that it was too difficult.

"While scientific and engineering programmes are not the easiest to do, but with interest and dedication, they are certainly far from impossible," he added.

Assisted by Roboforce, an organisation comprising MMU students and alumni, the participants got a feel for making robots by themselves, in preparation for this tournament.

During the competition, participants also involved in the activities and managed to apply what they learned during the workshop.

Working as teams, they fine-tuned their respective robots and did their best.

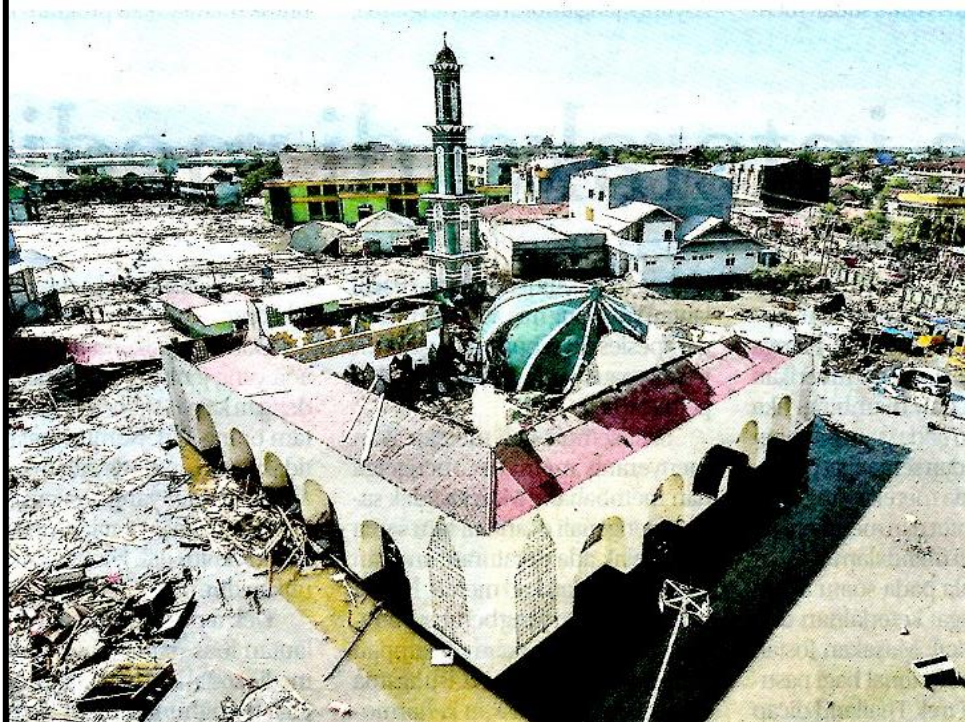

TOKYO - Pakar seismologi memberi amaran gempa susulan yang lebih kuat diramal menggegar bandar Palu dan Donggala di Sulawesi Tengah.

"Aktiviti seismik dan tsunami di Sulawesi memiliki ciri sama dengan gempa bumi besar yang pernah berlaku di Aceh pada 2004. Ia berpunca daripada pergerakan serta pelanggaran lapisan atau plat Bumi.

"Oleh itu, pihak berkuasa perlu memantau setiap gempa susulan dan berdepan segala kemungkinan. Mungkin ada gegaran yang lebih kuat berlaku dalam masa terdekat," katanya.

Kelmarin, Badan Meteorologi, Klimatologi dan Geofisika Indonesia (BMKG) berkata berlaku lebih 2 gempa susulan di Sulawesi Tengah selepas gempa bermagnitud 7 menggegar wilayah itu pada Jumaat lalu.

BMKG mencatat sebanyak 2 gempa susulan berkekuatan 2 hingga 6.2 skala Richter.

Keadaan itu sekali gus menyarkankan lagi kerja-kerja mencari dan menyelamatkan mangsa yang dipercayai masih terperangkap dalam runtuhan bangunan dan rumah.

Council: Panel reviewing Lynas must be objective

PETALING JAYA: The composition of the committee set up to review Lynas Corporation's rare earth project in Gebeng, Kuantan, are among factors critical in ensuring the nation's reputation as a stable and open investment destination, says the Malaysia-Australia Business Council (MABC).

"The credibility of the review, which includes the composition of the review team and the terms of reference, is critical to ensure that it does not damage Malaysia's reputation as a stable and open investment destination," the council said in a statement here yesterday.

While the council acknowledged and did not dispute the government's right to conduct a review of the operations, it said the review should be to assess any breaches of licences or for not meeting acceptable international standards.

"In the interests of maintaining investors' confidence, any review into Lynas Malaysia should be public, transparent, objective and evidence-based," the council said.

"The company should be provided with the opportunity to defend publicly its regulatory and environmental record since it commenced operations in 2012."

The statement by MABC follows the council's concerns over recent reports about a review of the operations of Lynas Malaysia, which has been producing high quality rare earth materials in Kuantan under extensive licensing conditions since September 2014.

"Malaysia has long been regarded as an attractive investment destination," it said.

"This is because of the reliable legal framework; predictable economic and political environment; and openness to investment."

MABC noted that Australian businesses had invested almost RM30bil in Malaysia as of end 2017 in several sectors including manufacturing, services, agribusiness, resources and the digital economy.

Last month, the Energy, Science, Technology, Environment and Climate Change Ministry announced that it would be setting up a committee to review Lynas' operations.

Deputy Minister in the Prime Minister's Department Fuziah Salleh was appointed the chairman.

Her appointment to lead the review committee had raised concerns among several parties.

Tey said MABC represented the interests of Australian businesses in Malaysia, with a mission to promote greater trade and investment ties between the two countries.

Australian businesses have invested almost RM30 billion in Malaysia as at the end of last year across a range of productive economic sectors, including manufacturing, services, agribusiness, resources and digital economy.

"This investment has created thousands of jobs for Malaysians and helped boost Malaysia's economic development, intellectual property and skills base," she said.

Twelve years too long for zero plastic

ENERGY, Science, Technology, Environment and Climate Change Minister Yeo Bee Yin has recently done a lot to break up the nation's love affair with single-use plastic. With the upcoming unveiling of the "Roadmap towards zero single-use plastic 2018-2030", Malaysia now has a targeted timeline to wean its people off single-use plastic.

But 12 years would appear to be much too long to get to that elusive zero. The reason given for this is that time is needed by the government to find affordable and accessible alternatives, and for plastic manufacturers to switch to produc-

ing more eco-friendly products.

Alternatives for single-use plastic bags – the reusable bags which are estimated to be equivalent to 170 plastic bags – have already been around for more than 10 years, as have reusable water bottles.

Where manufacturers are concerned, they should have known by now that the single-use plastic industry would come to an end eventually due to the constant negative press on their products over many years. They should turn to manufacturing high-grade plastic materials, reusable bags and bottles or paper straws.

For starters, the government

must stop issuing licences to manufacture low-end plastic products immediately.

It is a major challenge to sustain interest over a long period no matter how noble the goal is. Other priorities on the environment may put this down on the list of things to achieve or the people driving and implementing this roadmap might be transferred out, and this would reduce the effectiveness of the plan.

Thus, a period of five years would be more reasonable.

Tokyo

Dua orang maut selepas dibadai Taufan Trami yang turut menumbangkan pokok di atas trek kereta api selain membawa bersama serpihan bahan sekitar Tokyo, awal pagi semalam.

Tambahan, ratusan orang terkandas selepas perkhidmatan pengangkutan awam terpaksa ditutup.

Menjelang pagi tadi, taufan berkenaan sudah bergerak melepasi Jepun, namun angin kencang dan hujan lebat turut menyebabkan kerosakan pada jalan utama dan laluan kereta api.

Pegawai tempatan dan polis berkata, dua disahkan maut akibat taufan, masing-masing kerana tanah runtuh di barat Tottori serta lemas di Yamanashi, barat Tokyo.

Kedua-dua lelaki berkenaan dipercayai meninggal dunia, kelmarin selepas kawasan barat Jepun dibadai ribut tropika berkenaan.

Menurut agensi penyiaran

rasmi NHK, bencana itu turut menyebabkan dua penduduk dilaporkan hilang dan mencederakan lebih 120 lagi.

Angin kencang, hujan lebat

Trami mula membadaai Jepun malam kelmarin, membawa bersama angin kencang dan hujan lebat di kawasan yang sebelum ini sedia terjejas akibat siri cuaca buruk.

Taufan itu juga mengganggu operasi pengangkutan awam di negara ekonomi ketiga terbesar dunia itu apabila perkhidmatan kereta api laju dan kereta api malam dihentikan sementara serta lebih 1,000 penerbangan terpaksa dibatalkan.

Keadaan huru-hara itu berlanjutan pagi semalam berikutan bekalan elektrik masih terputus manakala landasan kereta api terhalang oleh pokok yang tumbang dan kira-kira 200 penerbangan kekal dibatalkan.

Lebih 400,000 isi rumah, kebanyakan di timur Jepun turut dilaporkan bergelap pagi ini kerana bekalan elektrik masih terputus.

Menurutnya, pihaknya menerima panggilan memaklumkan kejadian di beberapa kawasan sekitar Klang itu pada jam 4.57 petang.

Katanya, beberapa pokok dilapor tumbang dan menghalang laluan di lorong Kasawari 3 dan Taman Eng Ann.

"Anggota bomba tidak dapat ke lokasi kerana terdapat pokok tumbang halang laluan jalan.

"Terdapat dua kereta dihempap pokok namun tiada mangsa dilaporkan cedera dalam kejadian di Jalan Pekan Baru Off Jalan Meru," katanya.

Menurutnya, anggota bomba berjaya mengalihkan sisa pokok tumbang di lokasi tersebut untuk memastikan keadaan selamat kepada pengguna.

Beliau berkata, angin kencang turut melanda kawasan berhampiran Bulatan 100 menghala ke Shah Alam.

Katanya, sebaik tiba di lokasi, anggota mendapati dahan pokok menghempap dua kenderaan termasuk sebuah lori Nissan dan ken-

daraan pelbagai guna (MPV).

"Kedua-dua pemandu berusia 32 dan 52 tahun yang berada dalam kenderaan ketika kejadian dilapor selamat.

"Anggota bomba kemudian potong dan bersihkan dahan pokok dengan bantuan pekerja Majlis Perbandaran Klang (MPK)," katanya.

Mohd Rizal berkata, pihaknya turut menerima laporan berhubung kejadian bumbung diterbangkan angin di Jalan Merpati, Taman Eng Ann.

Katanya, panggilan daripada orang awam memaklumkan empat rumah terlibat ketika kejadian angin kencang tersebut.

"Di lokasi ini tiada pokok tumbang cuma bumbung empat rumah tercabut akibat angin kencang. Tiada kemalangan jiwa atau kecederaan dilaporkan," katanya.

Dalam pada itu, menerusi rakaman video yang tular di Facebook semalam memaparkan angin ribut turut menerbangkan bumbung pre-

mis perniagaan dan kilang.

Struktur bumbung itu kemudian dirakam jatuh menghempap beberapa kenderaan yang diletakkan di kawasan tempat letak kereta hingga menyebabkan ia mengalami kerosakan.

Pelayar Facebook, Mira Exora memberitahu keadaan angin yang menakutkan juga menyebabkan ada antara mereka terpaksa meluangkan azan.

"Allah uakbar... tengah-tengah makan tiba-tiba hujan ribut... Seram weyy... Gigil badan.. Hanya mampu tengok je.. Lepas azan terus berhenti hujan.. Allah! nak nangis tau... lokasinya di Bandar Baru Klang," katanya menerusi hantaran yang dihantar di Facebook miliknya.

Sementara itu, hujan lebat semalam turut menyebabkan beberapa kawasan di sekitar Petaling Jaya dinaiki air.

Beberapa buah kereta dilapor terkandas dan ditenggelami air berhampiran Mentari Court di sini.

Kejadian bencana petang semalam turut menyebabkan keadaan lalu lintas di kawasan terlibat mengalami kesesakan luar biasa akibat kejadian pokok tumbang.

Kubur besar tanam lebih 1,000 mayat

➔ Indonesia rayu bantuan antarabangsa bekalan ubat, makanan semakin kurang

Palu

Pasukan sukarelawan mula menggali kubur, semalam bagi mengebukikan lebih 1,000 mayat terkorban akibat dilanda tsunami dan gempa bumi di Sulawesi, minggu lalu.

Ketika sama dalam suasana suram ini, kerajaan Indonesia dengan harapan besar bersuara merayu bantuan antarabangsa.

Belum pun pulih daripada bencana yang sudah meragut lebih 840 nyawa setakat ini, satu lagi berita mencipta rasa gelisah selepas gempa bumi berukuran 4.4 magnitud melanda Blitar, Jawa Timur, semalam - tiga hari selepas Palu meneri-

ma gegaran menakutkan.

Empat hari berlalu dan beberapa kawasan terpencil masih tidak dapat dihubungi untuk menyalurkan bantuan, sekali gus menyukarkan kerja-kerja menyelamat, berikutan jentera berat tidak dapat dibawa masuk bagi menyelamatkan mangsa, selain bekalan perubatan yang semakin berkurangan.

Buka pintu agensi antarabangsa

Senario yang semakin buruk itu memaksa Presiden Joko Widodo membuka pintu kepada puluhan agensi bantuan antarabangsa dan pertubuhan bukan kerajaan untuk membantu kerja-kerja menyelamat.

"Malam tadi Presiden Jokowi

memberi kebenaran kepada kami untuk menerima bantuan antarabangsa bagi kerja-kerja menyelamat pada kadar segera," kata pegawai kanan kerajaan, Tom Lembong di Twitter sambil meminta pihak berkenaan menghubungi beliau secara langsung di media sosial itu atau menerusi email.

Pihak berkuasa khuatir jumlah kematian akan meningkat secara mendadak untuk tempoh beberapa hari lagi dan bersedia untuk menerima kemungkinan lebih buruk.

Sementara itu di Poboya, sebuah kawasan berbukit berhampiran Palu, pasukan sukarelawan menggali kubur sepanjang 100 meter untuk mengebukikan semua mayat dan diarahkan supaya bersiap sedia

mengebukikan bagi jumlah 1,300 mangsa.

Isytihar darurat 14 hari

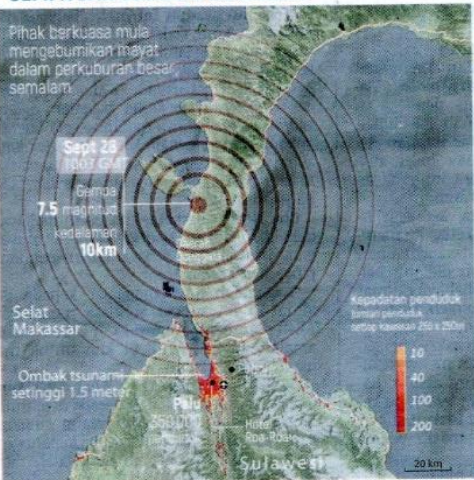
Pihak berkuasa kini dalam keadaan sangat terdesak untuk mengawal jangkitan penyakit akibat keadaan mayat yang semakin mereput dan mengisytiharkan tempoh darurat selama 14 hari.

Di kawasan lain, keadaan dikuatiri lebih buruk. Stesen penyiar Indonesia, Metro TV sempat menyiarkan rakaman udara di sekitar pedalaman Petobo yang kelihatan terjejas teruk.

Kerajaan menganggarkan di sini saja, sehingga 700 orang maut, dengan 1,747 kediaman musnah.

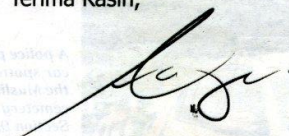

Pengerusinya, Tan Ching Hin berkata, laporan tersebut telah diserahkan kepada suruhanjaya berkenaan di Kompleks SPRM Selangor, Seksyen 16 di sini pada pukul 12 tengah hari.

Menurut beliau, pihaknya bertindak melaporkan isu kilang sisa plastik haram itu kepada SPRM selepas beberapa pertemuan dengan beberapa pihak bertanggungjawab sebelum ini termasuk dengan Majlis Daerah Kuala Langat (MDKL) gagal menyelesaikan masalah kilang haram berkenaan.

Quake survivors desperate for help

President promises to send food, supplies

PALU: Indonesian authorities scrambled to get aid and rescue equipment into quake-hit Sulawesi island and prepared to bury some of the dead, while shaken survivors streamed away from their ruined homes in search of food and shelter.

The confirmed death toll stood at 844 yesterday with a major local charity reporting that more than 1,200 bodies have been found as rescuers reached devastated outlying communities hit on Friday by a 7.5 magnitude earthquake and subsequent tsunami waves as high as six metres.

Accounts filtering out of remote areas brought news of devastation, including the deaths of 34 children at a Christian study camp.

Dozens of people were reported to be trapped in the rubble of several hotels and a mall in the small city of Palu with hundreds more were feared buried in landslides that engulfed villages.

President Joko Widodo told reporters getting those people out was a priority.

"The evacuation is not finished yet, there are many places where the evacuation couldn't be done because of the absence of heavy equipment, but last night equipment started to arrive," Widodo said.

"We'll send as much food supplies as possible today with Hercules planes, directly from Jakarta," he said, referring to C-130 military transport aircraft.

The disaster agency said later more heavy equipment and personnel were needed to recover bodies.

One woman was recovered alive from ruins overnight in the Palu neighbourhood of Balaroa, where houses were swallowed up when the earthquake caused soil liquefaction, the national rescue agency said.

Most of the confirmed deaths were in Palu, a city of about 380,000 people.

Officials fear the toll will rise steeply in the

coming days and are preparing for the worst, declaring a 14-day state of emergency.

At Poboya – in the hills above the devastated seaside city of Palu – volunteers yesterday began to fill a vast grave with the dead, with instructions to prepare for 1,300 victims to be laid to rest.

Authorities are desperate to stave off any disease outbreak caused by decomposing bodies, some now are riddled with maggots.

Three trucks arrived stacked with corpses wrapped in orange, yellow and black bags, an AFP reporter on the scene saw.

One-by-one they were dragged into the grave as excavators poured soil on top.

However, nearly three days after the quake, the extent of the disaster was not known as connections with remote areas up and down the coast are restored.

Of particular concern is Donggala, a region of 300,000 people north of Palu and close to the epicentre of the quake, and two other districts, which had been cut off from communications. The four districts have a combined population of about 1.4 million.

Aid worker Lian Gogali, who had reached Donggala district by motorcycle, said hundreds of people facing a lack of food and medicine were trying to get out but evacuation teams had yet to arrive and roads were blocked.

"It's devastating," she told Reuters by text.

A Reuters witness said queues at petrol stations on the approaches to Palu stretched for kilometres. Convoys carrying food, water and fuel awaited police escorts to prevent pilfering before heading towards the city while a stream of residents headed out.

The state energy company said it was airlifting in 4,000 litres of fuel, while Indonesia's logistics agency said it would send hundreds of tonnes of rice. The government has allocated 560 billion rupiah (RM155m) for disaster recovery. — Agencies

Convicts on the run after Indonesia disaster

JAKARTA: Some 1,200 Indonesian convicts are on the run from three different detention facilities in devastated Sulawesi after the region was rocked by a powerful earthquake and tsunami, a justice ministry official said.

One prison in tsunami-struck Palu city – built to hold just 120 people – saw most of its 581 inmates storm past guards and escape to freedom through walls collapsed by the massive 7.5 magnitude quake.

"Things were initially fine ... but not long after the quake, water erupted from under the prison yard causing prisoners to panic and then run onto the road," said Ministry of Justice official Sri Pugh Utami, adding that the water was not from the tsunami.

"I'm sure they escaped because they feared they would be affected by the earthquake. This is for sure a matter of life and death for the prisoners," she added.

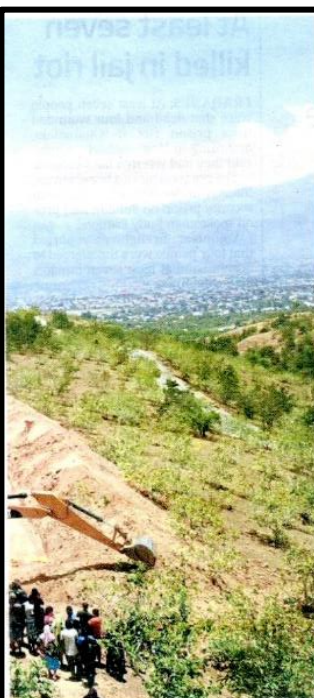
Inmates had fled from another overcapacity facility in Palu by breaking down its main door and another in Donggala, an area also hit by the disaster.

The Donggala jail was set on fire and all 343 inmates were now on the run, Utami said.

The arson was thought to have been sparked by angry detainees demanding to see their families.

"They panicked after learning that Donggala was badly hit by the earthquake," Utami said.

"Prison officials did negotiate with prisoners about allowing them to go to check on their families. But some prisoners were apparently not patient enough and committed the arson." — AFP
