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INDUSTRI besi dan keluli dijangka mengalami peningkatan kos pengeluaran mencecah RM1 bilion jika tarif elektrik dinaikkan Mac tahun depan.

Kuala Lumpur: Industri besi dan keluli akan mengalami peningkatan kos pengeluaran daripada RM855 juta kepada RM1 bilion apabila kenaikan tarif elektrik berkuat kuasa pada Mac tahun depan, menurut Persekutuan Industri Besi dan Keluli Malaysia (MISIF).

Kumpulan industri itu berkata, kenaikan tarif elektrik bagi pengguna industri akan mendorong peningkatan kos pengeluaran sekalus menjadikan peserta industri tempatan.

"Kami menyedari bahawa situasi sukar dan kebimbangan industri tidak mungkin diberikan pertimbangan serius walaupun banyak perbincangan bersama Suruhanjaya Tenaga, Tenaga Nasional Bhd (TNB) dan beberapa kementerian seperti Kementerian Perdagangan Antarabangsa dan Industri serta Kementerian Tenaga, Sains, Teknologi, Alam Sekitar dan Perubahan Iklim.

"Sebagai industri berintensifkan tenaga, elektrik adalah utiliti penting selain gas asli dan mewakili komponen kos pengeluaran kedua tertinggi selepas bahan mentah untuk industri besi dan keluli," katanya dalam satu kenyataan, semalam.

MISIF berkata, peserta industri berusaha menangani cabaran ini dan pada masa sama mengekang kos masing-masing untuk membolehkan mereka bersaing secara kompetitif dengan pergeluaran surau lain.

"Industri besi dan keluli menghadapi serangan import murah paling buruk dalam tempoh lima tahun.

"Walaupun baru saja pulih, industri mengalami kemaslahatan disebabkan sentimen susulan perang perdagangan Amerika Syarikat-China serta peningkatan persaingan daripada pengejaran serantau lain dan penggunaan peserta asing di peringkat tempatan," kata-

MISIF berharap pihak berkuasa berkaitan akan menghentikan kenaikan berterusan harga elektrik dan sebarang usaha untuk menangguhkan atau mengurangkan kenaikan tarif elektrik termasuk melarang se-

barang peningkatan pada masa depan bagi gas asli akan membantu melindungi perniagaan itu daripada risiko dan terjejas.

"Penting untuk mengekalkan daya saing kita yang mempunyai kesan meluas terhadap daya maju dan kelebihan industri strategik bagi pembangunan ekonomi Malaysia," katanya.

Pada 14 Disember lalu, TNB mengumumkan akan menaikkan surc妖 ketidakseimbangan pelepasan kos (ICPT) untuk pengguna bukan isi rumah mulai 1 Mac 2019 untuk mengimbangi kenaikan kos.

Surc妖 ICPT akan meningkat kepada 2.55 sen per kWh daripada kadar semasa 1.35 sen per kWh.

Saltwater crocs feeling the heat

Global warming affecting animal's fertility and mortality rate, says expert

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PASIR GUDANG: While many scientists believe that an asteroid wiped out the dinosaurs some 65 millions years ago, crocodiles continue to thrive on earth.

However, their existence in the wild is coming under threat today due to global warming.

Crocodile expert Dana Raj Shanmugam, 28, said the increase in temperatures has caused a devastating effect on the saltwater crocodiles' fertility rate.

Statistically, only one out of 100 infant saltwater crocodile survives beyond the first year after hatching from its egg.

"Although adults crocodiles are able to thermoregulate or to crawl to places with the desired temperature, the same could not be said for their young," he said yesterday.

Dana Raj, who works as an assistant manager at the Estuarine Crocodile Sanctuary near Tanjung Langsat Port here, said the extreme and irregular temperatures also affect crocodile eggs.

"These cold-blooded reptiles mate in accordance to the temperature and when it changes so drastically, it affects the crocodiles.

"There is a likely possibility that we may

not get to see an infant crocodile in the wild surviving past the first year in the not so distant future as a result of global warming," he said.

He pointed out that the Estuarine Crocodile Sanctuary here was built in 2009 with the idea of conserving the reptiles, and is now home to some 127 crocodiles from Sarawak, Pahang and Johor.

Dana Raj said the El Nino phenomenon hitting the world in recent years has impacted the mortality rate of the crocodiles here with a number of them dying due to heat stroke.

"Global warming is a real concern not only for the crocodiles but also the mangrove area surrounding this sanctuary.

"Mangrove areas are among the most vulnerable ecosystems especially with the rising sea levels due to global warming," he said.

Dana Raj said the sanctuary's main goal was to save the crocodile from extinction including studying breeding technology for the species.

The sanctuary also promotes educational tourism as visitors learn about crocodiles and the ecosystem.

The Estuarine Crocodile Sanctuary opens daily from 9am to 5pm.

Ban plastic straws for health's sake

I DISAGREE with what a reader wrote to an online news portal about the daily disposal of used plastic straws.

He said in reality, it was only a small part of all the plastic waste collected or dumped each day.

He was of the view that the ban imposed on plastics, especially plastic straws, was too harsh.

He went on to validate his case with stories from overseas, urging the local government to make an exception by letting consumers use plastic straws.

This is my personal view.

Nowadays, people are concerned about living a healthy life and are very careful about what they eat and drink.

They, too, know more people are diagnosed with cancer.

The people agree that the Government is doing the right thing by banning the use of plastics, especially drinking straws.

Eating and drinking using plastic utensils, bowls and cups, forks and spoons, chopsticks and wrappers are carcinogenic and could lead to cancer.

Therefore, we should support the Government in banning low quality plastic food containers or bags to hold hot food and hot drinks at all eateries.

Most importantly, this should include plastic drinking straws.

Using low-grade plastic containers, boxes, bags and straws will immediately leach dioxins and other toxic substances into the content.

There are medical reports saying it could be a health hazard to people who use these products too often.

Researchers have also confirmed that dioxins, once consumed, are likely to remain in our body.

It is not safe to use plastic straws and regardless of the volume of rubbish collected from used plastic waste and straws, the Government has the people's endorsement to implement the ban.

This is mainly for the sake of public health in the long run.

Industry leaders to chart TVET's path

Move is to develop skill standards to be on par with international levels

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PETALING JAYA: Leaders of Malaysian industries are working with the government to develop a skills standard and syllabus that are of international quality, says Department of Skills Development director-general Nidzam Kamarulzaman.

These industry players, known as Industry Lead Bodies (ILB), want to help ensure Malaysia's TVET is on par with developed nations like Australia and Canada, he said.

"In the next two years, over 30 major TVET (Technical and Vocational Education Training) ILBs will come together to create their own skills standards based on the practices of developed countries," he said.

He said they would work together to capitalise on their strengths as leading companies in their respective fields, and come up with a syllabus for TVET training centres under the skills department.

"This is a step towards a more independent



direction for TVET institutes in the country," he said.

In many developed countries, he said, industries take the lead in developing their own skills standards and syllabus for technical

and vocational education.

"They assist the government departments in doing so because they are the experts, they would know better," he said in an interview.

Some of the companies involved, according to Nidzam, are Malaysia Digital Economy Corporation, Malaysian Plastics Manufacturers Association and the Malaysian Association of Hotels.

Nidzam also urged local industries to play a bigger role.

"Come forward to assist the government to overcome prevalent mismatches in skills gap. There is only so much we can do ourselves," he said.

Since TVET training institutes serve to provide skilled manpower as required by the industry, the industry players should thus visit these institutes and identify the problems, and then work on it with the government.

"They can contribute their expertise and resources, such as sharing equipment and

keeping institutes updated on what is relevant to their current needs, rather than having centres blindly churn out graduates, leading to duplication of programmes, oversupply of graduates and mismatch in skills, among other problems.

"This way, we work towards producing graduates according to market needs," he said.

Nidzam said training agencies under the skills department that prescribe to the System Persijilan Kemahiran Malaysia (SPKM) are guided by industry-set standards known as the National Occupational Skills Standard (NOSS).

The SPKM oversees the accreditation and certification of skills training institutes.

He said NOSS is regularly reviewed by the skills department, based on technological changes.

Some of the agencies involved include Institut Latihan Perindustrian, Giat Mara, Federation of JPK Accredited Centres and Institut Kemahiran Tinggi Belia Negara.

Carbon set to surge again

Contracts may surge again by 20% to near US\$29 a tonne

LONDON: The cost of pollution in the European Union's (EU) cap-and-trade system is likely to surge again next year, contributing to rising electricity costs that are already uncomfortable for industry.

Carbon futures, reflecting the price factories and utilities pay for their emissions, tripled in 2018, making it the best performing major commodity of the year.

Those contracts may surge again in 2019, by 20% to near US\$29 a tonne or more for the first time in more than a decade, according to the median forecast of 13 brokers, analysts and traders surveyed by Bloomberg.

The gains are already roiling energy markets, driving up power prices across the continent and giving utilities an incentive to burn more natural gas than coal.

Another surge in 2019 will put under pressure the government officials and lawmakers who were architects of the increase this year as they sought to restore the credibility of carbon as a tool for reining in greenhouse gas emissions.

"There will be rumblings from east European countries and some big energy intensive companies if we hit 35 euros to 40 euros' next year," said Jahn Olsen, an analyst at Bloomberg NEF in London.

"The EU might not react if it happens gradually and reaches that level in November or December. Intervention is more likely if we get there in February."

Higher carbon costs have fed through to the cost of electricity, with German, French

and British power prices trading well above their five-year average.

It's also kept gas prices stronger than usual for the time of year.

Those gains awakened concerns industry and consumer groups have voiced for years about energy costs in Europe, which in some markets are more than double US levels.

French President Emmanuel Macron this month backed down to protests over fuel taxes, and German chancellor Angela Merkel is working to slow the pace at which coal plants are being closed after an increase in electricity costs.

Large power-consuming industries have expressed their discomfort about recent gains in prices and attributed the shift largely to carbon.

"This pressure will only increase and may cause further competitiveness challenges," Eurofer, the European industry group for metals, said in response to questions.

"The allowance is becoming tighter and tighter, so there isn't much room for selling them. Some producers will already be facing a shortage, and others will soon come up against it."

In normal markets, higher prices encourage more supplies to find their way to market. Not so in carbon, where volumes are fixed by governments. Poland already has asked EU lawmakers to intervene.

The European Commission declined to act.

The east European nation will now sell 55.8 million tonnes of EU allowances next year, worth about 1.4 billion euros at current market prices, a move that may mute some of the strength in carbon prices next year.

After six years in the doldrums, carbon allowances on the EU Emissions Trading System came to life at the start of this year following a years-long effort by policy makers to mop up a surplus of the credits that built up since the last recession.

Countries allocated too many carbon allowances and put in place renewables subsidies that helped curtail the need for power from plants that pollute.

The screws on the programme are set to tighten again in the coming years, with governments auctioning 40% fewer allowances starting next year.

"Auction volume is looking pretty poor," said Louis Redshaw, founder of Redshaw Advisors in London, which trades carbon.

"I suspect that many speculators are already positioned long." — Bloomberg

Lencong penerbangan elak Anak Krakatau

JAKARTA — Pihak berkuasa Indonesia semalam menaikkan tahap amaran bagi gunung berapi Anak Krakatau kepada tahap kedua tertinggi dan mengarahkan semua penerbangan menjauhi kawasan berkenaan selepas kejadian tsunami yang meragut hampir 430 nyawa.

Satu runtuhan kawah kepulauan gunung berapi ketika air laut pasang pada Sabtu lalu menyebabkan ombak setinggi 5 meter membadi kawasan perairan Selat Sunda, di antara Pulau Jawa dan Bali.

Pihak berkuasa memberi amaran bahawa kawah gunung berapi Anak Krakatau masih tidak stabil meningkatkan kebimbangan akan berlaku satu lagi runtuhan dan tsunami.

Penduduk diminta menjauhi kawasan pesisir pantai. Terdapat juga kebimbangan bahawa satu letusan lebih besar boleh berlaku.

Gunung berapi itu menjadi aktif sejak Ahad lalu, memuntahkan lahar dan batu, serta abu tebal hingga 3,000 meter di ruang udara.

Agensi Kebangsaan Geologi Indonesia, meningkatkan tahap amaran itu, menetapkan zon eksklusif 5 kilometer di sekililing gunung berapi itu.

“Sejak 23 Disember lalu, aktiviti

masih belum terhenti. Kami menjangkakan ia akan jadi lebih buruk,” kata setiausaha agensi berkenaan, Antonius Ratdomopurbo.

Satu lapisan nipis abu gunung berapi melitupi bangunan dan kenderaan di kawasan perairan barat Pulau Jawa sejak kelmarin. Penduduk diminta memakai topeng muka dan go-

gel ketika keluar dari rumah.

“Semua penerbangan dilencangkan disebabkan abu gunung berapi Anak Krakatau,” menurut agensi kawalan trafik udara kerajaan Indonesia, AirNav dalam satu kenyataan.

Pihak berkuasa penerbangan awam menyatakan tiada mana-mana lapangan terbang akan terjejas. — Reuters

Gunung Mayon muntahkan debu putih

MANILA - Gunung berapi paling aktif di Filipina, Gunung Mayon mula memuntahkan kepulan debu putih setinggi 500 hingga 600 meter dari kawahnya pagi semalam, lapor agensi berita *Xinhua* yang memetik seorang pakar tempatan.

Pakar gunung berapi di Institut Vulkanologi dan Seismologi Filipina (Phivolcs), Eduardo Laguerta memberitahu *Xinhua* bahawa letusan air bawah tanah atau letupan disebabkan tekanan wap air berlaku pada pukul 8.17 pagi dan 8.28 pagi (waktu tempatan), namun tiada letusan besar dijangka berlaku.

Phivolcs menyatakan gunung berapi itu berada pada tahap aktif sederhana menyebabkan pihak berkuasa mengeluarkan amaran kepada penduduk setempat agar menjauhi zon seluas 6 kilometer (km) di sekeliling Gunung Mayon.

Gunung berbentuk kon setinggi 2,460 meter itu terletak di wilayah Albay, 300km dari ibu negara Filipina, Manila di Pulau Luzon.


Dalam satu buletin yang dikeluarkan semalam, Phivolcs memberi peringatan bahawa satu letusan mengejut, tumpahan lahar, aliran debu piroklastik tebal dan hujan debu boleh terjadi serta membahayakan kawasan atas dan pertengahan gunung berapi itu.

Institut berkenaan turut merekodkan satu kejadian gempa gunung berapi dalam tempoh 24 jam sebelum letupan disebabkan wap air itu.

ROM - Seramai 28 orang cedera di Sicily, Itali kelmarin dalam satu kejadian gempa bumi yang tercetus akibat letusan Gunung Etna, lapor agensi berita *Xinhua* yang memetik pihak berkuasa Itali.

Letusan gunung berapi itu mengakibatkan gempa bumi sekuat 4.8 pada skala Richter berlaku pada pukul 3.19 pagi (waktu tempatan) dengan kedudukan 1 kilometer (km), menurut Institut Geofizik dan Vulkanologi Itali dalam satu kenyataan.

Pusat gempa terletak beberapa kilometer dari utara Catania, bandar kedua terbesar di Sicily.

Sekurang-kurangnya 10 daripada 28 mangsa cedera dibawa ke hospital dan tidak mengalami kecederaan serius, lapor agensi berita *Ansa*.

Kira-kira 600 penduduk lain terpaksa dipindahkan keluar dari kediaman mereka sebagai langkah berjaga-jaga sejak kelmarin.

Kawasan paling buruk yang terjejas akibat gempa itu adalah di Zafferana Etnea dan Fleri, Catania. Selain itu, empat perbandaran, semua di sekeliling Cataina turut terjejas.

Gabenor Sicily, Nello Musumeci menerusi Facebook dan Twitter menyatakan beliau sudah bertemu pihak berkuasa di semua perbandaran yang terjejas kelmarin bagi satu pelan pascabencana.

Gunung Etna setinggi 3,350 meter dari paras laut terletak di bahagian timur Sicily dan merupakan gunung berapi paling besar dan paling tinggi Eropah. - Bernama

Bracing for another tsunami

Indonesia hikes up danger level for erupting Anak Krakatau volcano

CARITA: Indonesia has raised the alert level for the erupting Anak Krakatau volcano to the second highest, and ordered all flights to steer clear, days after it triggered a tsunami that killed at least 430 people.

The government yesterday confirmed that fresh activity at the crater threatened to trigger another deadly wave and also ordered all flights to steer clear of the area.

Authorities also widened a no-go zone around rumbling Anak Krakatau to 5km up from a previous 2km – and warned shell-shocked residents to stay away from the coast, after more than 400 were killed by Saturday night's wave.

Plumes of ash burst into the sky as pyroclastic flows – hot gas and other volcanic material – flowed down the crater, threatening anyone too close to the volcano and raising the risk of rough seas for boats in the vicinity.

"There is a danger of more eruptions," said national disaster agency spokesman Sutopo Purwo Nugroho.

"People (near the volcano) could be hit by hot rocks, pyroclastic flows and thick ash."

Authorities raised the crater's status to high alert, the second-highest warning on the country's four-point danger scale, while aviation officials ordered flights to be redirected.

The new flows posed no immediate danger to nearby towns as the volcano sits in the middle of the Sunda Strait between Java and Sumatra islands.

But the status change sparked

new fears with many residents already scared and refusing to return to their communities over fears of another tsunami.

"This worries me," said Ugi Sugianti, a cook at the Augusta Hotel in hard-hit Carita. "I've already left."

Sukma, a security guard at the shattered Mutiara Carita Cottages, added: "Just please pray for us and that everything will be okay."

Authorities, however, have warned that the crater of Anak Krakatau, or child of Krakatau, remains fragile, raising fears of another collapse and tsunami, and have urged residents to stay away from the coast.

The volcano has been rumbling on and off since June but has been

particularly active since Sunday, also spewing lava and rocks, and sending huge clouds of ash up to 3,000m into heavily overcast skies.

The national geological agency, in raising the alert level to the second-highest, set the exclusion zone around the island.

"Since Dec 23, activity has not stopped ... We now anticipate a further escalation," said Antonius Ratnomoipuro, secretary of the geological agency.

A section of the crater – which emerged at the site of the Krakatau volcano, whose massive 1883 eruption killed at least 36,000 people – collapsed after an eruption and slid into the ocean, triggering Saturday night's killer wave.

Before and after satellite images

taken by Japan's space agency showed that a two square kilometre chunk of the volcano island had collapsed into the water.

At least 430 people were killed in the disaster, with 1,495 people injured and another 159 missing.

Nearly 22,000 people have also been evacuated and are living in shelters.

Yesterday, the disaster agency said that wind was blowing "ash and sand" from the volcano to the nearby towns of Cilegon and Serang on Java, and advised residents to wear masks and glasses if they had to venture outdoors.

Torrential rains have sparked flooding in some areas, hampering the relief effort and heaping more misery on the stricken region, as

thousands cram emergency shelters. Medical workers have warned that clean water and medicine supplies were running low – stoking fears of a public health crisis.

Indonesia, a vast South-East Asian archipelago, is one of the most disaster-hit nations on Earth due to its position straddling the so-called Pacific Ring of Fire, where tectonic plates collide.

The tsunami was Indonesia's third major natural disaster in six months, following a series of powerful earthquakes on the island of Lombok in July and August and a quake-tsunami in September that killed around 2,200 people in Palu on Sulawesi island, with thousands more missing and presumed dead.

The disaster agency has said it installed new sensors to better monitor tremors at the volatile volcano.

The agency initially said there was no tsunami threat at all, even as the killer wave crashed ashore.

It was later forced to issue a correction and an apology as it pointed to a lack of early warning systems for the high death toll.

One of the hardest-hit areas – Tanjung Lesung – is on a list of 10 destinations that Jakarta wants to turn into another Bali, the holiday island hotspot which draws millions of tourists annually.

"We need to have (tsunami) early warning systems, especially in tourist destinations," Indonesia's tourism minister Arief Yahya said yesterday.

"We're going to make that happen." — AFP/Reuters



Indonesia, menaikkan amaran gunung berapi ke tahap kedua tertinggi, semalam ke atas gunung berapi Anak Krakatau yang mencetus tsunami, minggu lalu selepas amaran terdahulu bahan aktiviti baru di kawah gunung terabit mengancam untuk mencetuskan satu lagi gelombang maut.

"Semua penerbangan dilencangkan berikutan amaran merah akibat debu gunung berapi Anak Krakatau," kata agensi kawalan trafik udara kerajaan, AirNav dalam satu kenyataan.
