Jeti nelayan jadi tarikan agropelancongan

Lokasi pancing udang galah bakal dipromosi, jana pendapatan penduduk

Beberapa jeti nelayan di Sungai Muar yang menjadi lokasi popular aktiviti memancing udang galah diangkat menjadi tarikan agropelancongan terkemuka negara pada masa akan datang.

Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Asas Tani, Datuk Salahuddin Ayub, berkata ia sekali gus dapat mem-

bantu nelayan di kawasan ini meningkatkan pendapatan mereka.

Katanya, beberapa jeti nelayan seperti Gerisek, Panchor, Bukit Kepong dan Renchong sudah dikenali sebagai lokasi terbaik bagi kaki pancing untuk menangkap udang galah dan potensi ini perlu diperkasakan bagi memberi manfaat yang besar kepada penduduk setempat, khususnya nelayan darat di kawasan berkenaan.

"Saya berasakan sudah sampai masa kementerian mempromosi secara besar-besaran lokasi terba-

bit supaya kawasan ini menjadi destinasi agropelancongan.

"Mereka boleh melaksanakan pelbagai kegiatan termasuk pertandingan memancing udang galah dan tidak mustahil dalam tempoh terdekat, kita boleh adakan pertandingan sama pada peringkat antarabangsa pula.

Manfaat keunikan Sungai Muar

"Saya lihat keunikan Sungai Muar ini boleh membekalkan spesies udang galah secara konsisten pada masa tertentu dan ia sesuai untuk diangkat sebagai destinasi agropelancongan di kawasan ini," katanya selepas menghadiri Pertandingan Memancing Udang Galah Pering-

kat Kebangsaan Sempena Sambutan Ulang Tahun Keputeraan Sultan Johor di Jeti Nelayan Gerisek, di sini, semalam.

Salahuddin berkata, beliau akan memastikan kementerian akan memberi bantuan dan insentif supaya jeti nelayan berkenaan akan muncul sebagai destinasi agropelancongan terkenal.

"Spesies udang galah dalam kategori terbaik di Sungai Muar akan dapat menarik perhatian kaki pancing dan saya yakin dengan bantuan kementerian termasuk teknologi ternakan udang galah yang kita lepaskan semula akan dapat memperkasakan lagi sektor ini.

"Ia adalah usaha pemodenan dalam sektor ini dan apa yang pen-

ting, saya gembira pendapatan nelayan akan bertambah. Difahamkan, bagi udang galah gred C nelayan meraih pendapatan antara RM70 hingga RM80 sekilogram dan RM100 ke atas bagi gred A.

"Kita juga akan bekerjasama dengan **Jabatan Alam Sekitar (JAS)** supaya kelestarian sungai terpelihara daripada pencemaran supaya kita dapat kekalkan spesies udang galah ini," katanya.

Ditanya mengenai fenomena penyerobosan air masin yang turut mengancam habitat haiwan akuatik di Sungai Muar, beliau berkata, pihaknya akan bekerjasama dengan Kementerian Air, Tanah dan Sumber Asli bagi mencari penyelesaian isu berkenaan.

RARE EARTH PLANT

ANY **LYNAS** BENEFIT NOT WORTH THE RISK

LYNAS Corporation is an Australian rare earths mining and refining company listed on the Australian Securities Exchange.

Lynas Malaysia Sdn Bhd was set up in 2006 and it built the 100ha Lynas Advanced Materials Plant (LAMP) in a low-lying swamp in Gebeng, near the South China Sea, with 500,000 to 700,000 people living within a 30km radius.

It may seem logical for the plant to be close to mines, to minimise logistic challenges. The unrefined ore is shipped to Malaysia because Australia cannot provide highly-skilled manpower, chemical reagents and utilities, such as water supply and natural gas, needed to process rare earth minerals.

Other factors are geographic location, efficient government agencies and legal framework. In addition, Malaysia's government provided a 12-year tax exemption to Lynas. There could be another reason: cheaper workforce.

Plant operations started in 2012. LAMP is designed to process

65,000 tonnes of rare earth concentrates and will produce 22,000 tonnes of high-purity rare earth element.

To accomplish this, 500 cubic metres per hour of water, 110,000 tonnes of sulphuric acid, 150,000 tonnes of hydrochloric acid and 110,000 tonnes of lime are consumed every year.

Three categories of waste have been generated from the plant: three gypsum-type wastes, waste water and flue gas.

The latter two are purged into the environment, while solid waste include water leached purification (WLP), neutralisation underflow residue and flue gas desulphurisation residues.

It is true that WLP is considered "low-level radioactive material", but there are 256 Olympic-sized swimming pools worth of WLP stockpiled at temporary storage sites in Gebeng.

The Energy, Science, Technology, Environment and Climate Change Ministry has announced that the solid waste will be removed prior to the expiration of

Lynas' temporary storage licence (TOL) on Sept 2.

If Lynas' claims of safety are true, then Australia should be willing to accept the waste product.

However, Australian members of parliament have refused any "importation of waste back to Australian soil", and previously expressed "grave concern" about Malaysia's initial approval of a licence to Lynas.

We believe it is immoral to put the onus on the Kuantan-Kemaman community "to prove that Lynas (LAMP) is unsafe", that is, to be lab rats in a natural experiment.

The onus to prove unquestionable safety is on Lynas. We also believe that no one has any responsibility to prove unquestionable danger before LAMP is shut.

No one knows how safe (or how hazardous) the plant, unrefined ore, transport process and waste itself – including volume, temporary storage and permanent disposal – are.

Assertions that elements of

LAMP are "unquestionably safe" are false and misleading.

Even if we adopt a higher burden of proof for danger, there is a presence of danger that is non-negligible. Therefore, the "precautionary principle" in public health is paramount in the case of Lynas.

If the waste from LAMP is safe, why is Australia refusing to accept it?

There are lessons from Mitsubishi's rare earth factory in Bukit Merah in the 1980s and China's refusal recently to accept the plastic waste of the West, both of which indicate that public health is more important than any short-term and small economic impact. Say nothing about the reduction of fresh water supply for Malaysians, the risk of leakage of

temporary storage facilities, the airborne pollution of dust and particles during transport, or the possibility of flooding or man-made accidents.

We believe the terms of the agreement with Lynas must be respected, and the attorney-general and legal practitioners should argue for the government's position in the matter.

But the overarching and long-term principles are clear: any possible benefit of Lynas is not worth the risk. Malaysia must never be used as a dumping ground.

Elak projek jejas kelestarian alam

Kita harap perkembangan ECRL yang menitikberatkan soal kelestarian alam sekitar, dijadikan teladan dalam setiap projek yang akan dilaksanakan pada masa depan.

Kita puji tindakan pemaju utama ECRL, China Communications Construction Company Ltd (CCCC), memperuntukkan kira-kira RM10 juta bagi melaksanakan kerja pemuliharaan dan pemin-dahan hidupan liar yang terancam akibat projek itu. Ini harus dijadikan penanda aras, dengan premium tertentu diletakkan pemaju untuk pemuliharaan alam sekitar.

Tangani segera masalah banjir kilat

SAUDARA PENGARANG,

JABATAN Pengairan dan Saliran (JPS), Majlis Daerah Kerian (MDK) dan Jabatan Perikanan Perak perlu segera menyiasat punca masalah banjir kilat yang sering berlaku di Kampung Tanah 100, Sungai Bakau, Parit Buntar.

Kejadian yang berlarutan sejak lebih 10 tahun lalu itu kini semakin kerap berlaku menyebabkan peralatan seperti perabot di rumah penduduk mengalami kerosakan.

Masalah ini telah dimaklumkan kepada pihak berwajib, namun hingga sekarang tiada tindakan berkesan yang diambil bagi menanganinya.

Difahamkan banjir kilat itu berpunca akibat sistem saliran yang tidak sempurna dan pembuangan sisa dari kolam ternakan ikan keli berhampiran.

Saliran sepanjang 200 meter berhampiran kolam ternakan ikan keli di kampung tersebut dipenuhi sisa lumpur manakala kawasan sekitarnya pula digenangi air yang bertakung

serta berbau busuk.

Terdapat juga kawasan sawah terbiar kerana tidak boleh diusahakan akibat diancam limpahan sisa buangan dari kolam ternakan ikan keli itu.

Walaupun kejadian ini sudah lama berlaku dan mengancam kehidupan penduduk kampung, belum ada pihak yang tampil untuk menyelesaikannya. Selain itu, bagaimana projek akuakultur boleh dibenarkan beroperasi di kampung itu tanpa mengambil kira kesannya terhadap alam sekitar dan kehidupan penduduk tempatan?

Justeru Pejabat Tanah dan Galian (PTG), **Jabatan Alam Sekitar (JAS)** dan Jabatan Perikanan Perak perlu menyiasat perkara ini dan mengambil tindakan tegas jika terdapat sebarang pelanggaran undang-undang.

No gas leak detected after explosion, says Puah

PENGERANG: There was no gas leak after an explosion and fire at the Pengerang Integrated Complex, said Johor International Trade, Investment and Utility Committee chairman Jimmy Puah Wee Tse.

"The situation in the area is 'secure,' he said, giving an assurance to residents there that they need not panic.

The incident, which took place at 1.25am yesterday, was due to a burst pipe and no tanks exploded, he said.

"It would have been a serious case if it involved the tanks but it was the pipes that exploded, not the tank," he told a press conference yesterday.

Two Malaysians between the ages of 28 and 30, believed to be working as security guards at the site, were injured.

Johor Health, Environment and Agriculture Committee chairman Dr Sahrudin Jamal said one of them was sent to a hospital.

He was hit by shards of glass

from the explosion, he added.

"We are currently in talks with Petronas and the Welfare Department to help those living nearby who are affected by the explosion," he said.

He added that those affected need to make a police report in order to get the assistance.

Dr Sahrudin also said that the Department of Environment had confirmed that there was no toxic waste lingering in the air here.

In a statement, Petronas said

that its emergency and response team (ERT) was deployed and the fire was contained within 30 minutes.

"The situation is under control and all relevant authorities have been informed," the statement said.

Kota Tinggi OCPD Supt Ashmon Bajah said that the fire took place in one of the project sites within the complex.

"The Petronas ERT received the report and deployed five fire

engines with 30 firemen who managed to control and put out the fire at around 2.15am," he said.

Supt Ashmon said a joint investigation was being carried out by various agencies.

Pengerang assemblyman Datuk Seri Azalina Othman Said said she was saddened with the news as it happened in her constituency.

"I hope that such an incident will not happen again as such mega projects involving oil and gas has a high risk of accidents," she said.

Ikea to rent, recycle furniture in green push

STOCKHOLM: Ikea will start renting and recycling furniture worldwide as part of an eco-friendly drive to address concerns its affordable, flat-pack business model leads to overconsumption and waste.

Sceptics see the Swedish giant's initiative as a marketing ploy, while supporters see a genuine sea change. Either way, Ikea says it plans to become a circular business by 2030.

The company has already begun repairing and re-packaging products in every store that have been damaged in transit, as well as allowing customers to return products for resale or donation

to charities.

Ingka Group, which operates 367 Ikea stores worldwide, earlier this year launched a pilot leasing furniture in four countries, a project it now plans to expand to all of its 30 markets.

But Ikea's 2030 goal could be difficult to attain, given its current carbon footprint.

"The main challenges in making a shift to a circular economy are related to sustainable logistics (transport, storage, product assembly), services (repair, maintenance), and waste management," said Cecilia Cassinger, a professor of strategic communication at Sweden's Lund University.

Ikea aimed to reduce its overall climate impact by 70 per cent on average per product by 2030.

"The biggest opportunity for reducing the Ikea greenhouse gas footprint comes in raw materials and the life of products in the homes of Ikea customers," it said in a 2018 sustainability report.

According to another report issued earlier this year, Ikea's raw materials represented more than a third of its greenhouse gas emissions, at 36.4 per cent.

Transporting goods and customers' transportation to stores — which are usually located outside city centres — accounted for 19.4 per cent of emissions. **AFP**

Shaharudin berkata, siasatan dilakukan di bawah Akta 672 Pengurusan Sisa Pepejal, Seksyen 71 (1) pembuangan sampah haram di tempat awam yang boleh dikenakan hukuman denda minimum RM10,000 dan maksimum RM100,000 atau penjara sehingga maksimum lima tahun atau kedua-duanya sekali jika sabit kesalahan.

Sebelum ini, kebakaran tempat pembuangan sampah

di tepi Sungai Benus, di sini yang berlarutan selama hampir seminggu menimbulkan keresahan dalam kalangan penduduk setempat susulan asap tebal dan risiko lain yang dihadapi.

Situasi itu juga mendedahkan keadaan sebenar kawasan berkenaan yang menjadi tempat pembuangan sampah haram sejak sekian lama hingga menyebabkan Sungai Benus semakin tertimbus dan tercemar.

+ Cleaners must reduce plastic use too

The public is questioning why the authorities are allowing the use of plastic bags by cleaning contractors when the public is asked to pay for using such bags.

Plastic pollution is a global problem that we must address using a holistic and sustainable method.

Malah, dengan kelebihan yang ditampilkan, ia sesuai

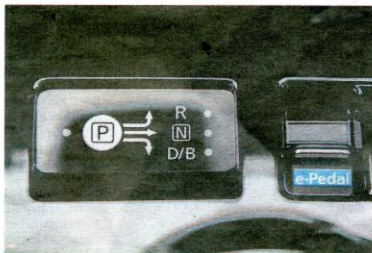
sebagai kenderaan harian di Kuala Lumpur, namun apa yang perlu dipertimbangkan adalah infrastruktur pengecas.

FERTILISER POSER

Irked by false accusations against Lynas

AS a retired Australian fighter pilot who spent three years in the air defence of Malaysia just after independence, and whose daughter was born in Penang at that time, I am dismayed by the false accusations published by many citizens and lawmakers about the so-called environmental hazards of the Lynas rare earth plant in Kuantan.

A scientific report, published in Malay last May, proves that mixing the very slightly radioactive water-leached purification residue material with other com-

pletely safe material make up a fertiliser called CondiSoil.

This is similar to the expensive super-phosphate used in farming throughout the world and on my farm near Canberra.

Radiation measurements showed that the residual radiation in the soils and plants fertilised by CondiSoil was far below the Malaysian threshold of permitted safe radiation, which, by the way, is 10 times more stringent than other world nations, including the United States, European Union, other Asean coun-

tries and Australia.

I would be grateful if you would publish some of this information, or at least pose questions about it to experts who are aware of this and other reports proving the safety of the Lynas advance material plant (Lamp), but who refuse to authorise the use of CondiSoil to eliminate the residue stockpiles while also providing plantation fertiliser.

PublicInvest upgrades TNB to 'buy'

KUALA LUMPUR: Public Investment Bank (PublicInvest) upgraded Tenaga Nasional Bhd (TNB) to "buy" from "neutral".

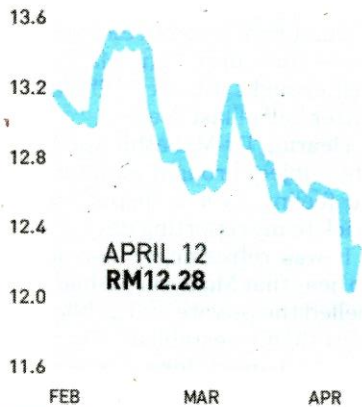
In a note yesterday, it said at current market price, TNB's dividend yield of four per cent looked attractive.

"We are maintaining our earnings forecasts with an unchanged discounted cash flow-based target price of RM14.12.

"Although sentiment was dragged down by news of Khazanah Nasional Bhd's share disposal, TNB's fundamental remains unaffected and, hence, we see the weakness in share price as a good opportunity to accumulate.

"While the incentive-based regulation framework would cap the return on TNB's regulated assets, we believe its profitability could still be improved through cost efficiency and higher return

on its non-regulated assets."

In an announcement to Bursa Malaysia, TNB said Khazanah sold 85 million shares, which represented a 1.5 per cent stake in the national utility.

The disposal saw Khazanah's shareholding in the utility giant

dropping to 27.27 per cent from 28.76 per cent, previously.

It also said Bloomberg data showed the disposal by Khazanah was worth RM1 billion at a price of RM12.33 a share, representing a two per cent discount to its closing price of RM12.58.

"Although we believe the disposal was part of asset value realisation by Khazanah, TNB remains a strategic holding of the sovereign wealth fund.

"Given that TNB's market capitalisation fell by RM18.5 billion year-to-date, compared with a loss in revenue of RM640 million in financial year 2018, we feel the selldown was over-rated," it said.

On the upcoming electricity tariffs review in June, the investment bank said there was less pressure to hike the base tariff for residential customers due to falling global coal prices. **Bernama**

EMERGING TECHNOLOGY

NAVIGATING THE FINE LINE ON TECH SECURITY AND PRIVACY

In an increasingly intrusive digital world, there's a vital need to protect the rights of the public

TECHNOLOGY, in this day and age, knows you more than your friends and family do.

In some cases, tech knows you more than you know yourself — your likes and preferences, your deepest desires and possibly even traits that you have not yet discovered.

Emerging technologies allow tools to “read” your physical, mental and social behaviours then predict what you will do next. Beyond prediction, technological tools can also deceive and manipulate. The possibilities and the power are endless.

Oftentimes, financial motives are behind these developments. As per the modern day mantra, “Data is the new oil”, and we are the data to be mined — with or without our consent.

Revelations after revelations of sketchy business operations force unwitting users to believe they are being spied on from the comfort of their homes to the confined spaces in the aircraft.

In February, Google admitted to embedding built-in microphones into its Nest Secure home security solutions, two years after it was introduced. The feature was suspiciously omitted from the product's tech specs and unsuspecting users eventually questioned if they had been spied on in those years. In the same month, Singapore Airlines confessed to installing a camera beneath the inflight entertainment screens on its aircraft. Both denied any ill intention and insisted that the cameras and microphones had not been activated.

As technology advances and converges, so do the functions of technology players in order for them to stay relevant. Facebook, for instance, started off as a social platform for friends and family to keep in touch. It has morphed, however, to become the main source of news for the ma-

jority of people globally.

As the presence and power of tech players become more pervasive, so do their responsibilities and the expectations of them to carry out their role diligently. Facebook, a social media tech giant, has been struggling to get out of the soup, vis-à-vis issues of disinformation, hate speech and pornography, among others.

Countries are pushing for social media platforms to play a more significant role in combating these issues, or they may be legally bound to do so. This follows the footsteps of Germany, which has tightened its law to regulate social media platforms to counter online abuse.

YouTube on the other hand, has been under fire for its recommendation algorithm that fuels the dissemination of disinformation, political extremism and the sexual exploitation of children. YouTube sets “engagement” as its primary business goal, and since 2012 decided that recommending videos is crucial to ensure viewers’ eyes are kept on the site. Perpetually hammered and accused of prioritising profits over the safety of users, it recently announced plans to reduce recommendations of “borderline content” and disinformation. The document

also outlines YouTube's aim to achieve, not just growth, but “responsible growth”. However, it continues to face criticism for only attending to the issues sporadically.

In Malaysia's case, in our eagerness to catch up with the technological advancements of the fourth industrial revolution (4IR), focus on the security and privacy aspects need to be synchronised. Understanding the dark side that technology could inflict, without entirely focusing on financial benefits is essential.

It is a joint responsibility of various parties.

FIRST, the role of government to ensure the right policies are in place at the desirable speed, aligned with the rapid growth of technology as well as enforcing these policies vigorously. We can be building flying cars, but regulations and standards need to first be in place. Further, Malaysia needs to localise policies accordingly and not blindly adopt on what works for other countries. Moreover, emphasis needs to be put into the responsibility that comes with technology applications for both users and creators, which includes domestic and international technology providers in Malaysia.

SECOND, creating citizen

awareness towards the dangers of misusing technology and how we can protect ourselves, which includes practising good cyber hygiene. Citizens also need to be aware that at times, they are their own worst enemy, and that technology only intensifies it. Such is the case of disinformation for instance, where human biases that react to seditious posts will generate quick engagements, resulting in faster dissemination of toxic videos and “bad virality”.

THIRD, the role of technology players. Regardless of whether they are pursuing the areas of Internet of Things, artificial intelligence or Big Data Analytics, which could be applied in an array of sectors, the responsibility to protect users must be embedded.

Beyond that, technology experts themselves need to recognise that the power to navigate technological growth is in their hands. Unfortunately, being a bad actor has tempted many, and eerily, technology is a good servant to an evil master.

Indonesia lifts tsunami warning

JAKARTA: Indonesia lifted a tsunami warning but urged people to remain vigilant and evacuate to higher ground after an earthquake of magnitude 6.8 struck off the coast of its island of Sulawesi.

Indonesia suffered its highest death toll in more than a decade last year, following two major tsunamis and several earthquakes, with more than 3,000 killed in Palu, also in Central Su-

lawesi, the site of yesterday's earthquake.

The geophysics agency lifted the warning around 40 minutes after it was imposed.

There were no immediate reports of damage or casualties from the quake, which hit 280km south of the province of Gorontalo at a depth of 43km.

The quake was felt strongly in the nickel mining region of Morowali. **Reuters**
