Residents up in arms over illegal dumpsite

Apartment dwellers protest to have waste removed and action taken against culprits

RESIDENTS of Kinrara Mas Apartment in Bukit Jalil, Kuala Lumpur, say the unbearable stench and pollution from an illegal dumpsite on a neighbouring piece of land have drastically affected their lives.

They organised a protest to urge the authorities to remove the waste and take action against the culprits.

The residents claimed that rubbish had been dumped on the private land since March, and believed it included toxic waste because of foul smell emanating from the site.

Two residents, who only wanted to be known as Peter and Jimmy, claimed that many residents suffered asthma attack, diarrhoea and flu because of the unhygienic environment.

"Some have even moved out of their homes as they were unable to bear the foul smell just 5m from the nearest apartments," said Peter.

Another resident, who introduced herself only as Loh, said they could smell the stench even when they are indoors with all their windows and doors closed.

"We end up wearing masks even at home. The metal grilles and pipes have turned black and rusty. There must be some sort of toxic chemical reaction from the waste," she said.

A resident who wanted to be identified only as Heng, said both her daughters encountered health issues because of the pollution.

"My five-year-old was admitted to hospital about two months ago as she was coughing badly. The doc-

tors were unable to diagnose the exact cause," she said.

"One week after she was discharged, she fell sick again. Her health improved only after we moved temporarily to a friend's house."

She said her older daughter, who is six, suffered from a skin problem.

"Their medical problems would recur whenever we return home. We are staying in Puncak Jalil temporarily until the problem is resolved," she added.

Kinrara Mas Apartment working committee representative Vanessa Liew said numerous complaints were made to Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL), Subang Jaya Municipal Council (MPSJ), Solid Waste Management and Public Cleansing Corporation Sdn Bhd (SWCorp) and the Department of Environment (DOE).

"To-date, neither the landowner nor the authorities have removed the waste or addressed the pollution although the land is not a designated waste disposal site," she said.

"There seems to be someone flattening the waste to level the ground rather than remove the rubbish."

"We are appealing to Energy, Science, Technology, Environment and Climate Change Minister Yeo

Bee Yin and Seputeh MP (Teresa Kok) to resolve our plight," said Liew.

"What the residents want is for all the waste to be immediately removed and disposed of, and

make sure there is no toxic materials there."

Another committee member, Gan Kian Yeap, claimed there has been three fires at the site.

"It took a while for the firefighters to put them out because they were underground fires."

An MPSJ spokesperson said the area fell under DBKL's purview, and that the council referred the matter to its counterpart.

DBKL Health and Environment Department said in a statement that the stench was due to leachate contamination and that the rubbish dumped on the 3.3ha site comprised domestic and construction waste.

"The land was also misused. The landowner appointed a contractor to level the site but the contractor carried out illegal waste disposal activities without the landowner's knowledge," the statement read.

"That resulted in leachate seeping underground and flowing to nearby housing areas. Our department, along with SWCorp and DOE's Kuala Lumpur offices, issued notices requiring immediate site clean-up works and a report submitted by May 28."

The statement also said the landowner cleaned up the dumpsite and leachate suctioned out, adding that SWCorp would continue to monitor the issue from time to time.

Meanwhile, Kok's secretary, Alice Lan, said officers from DBKL's Health and Environment Department would be asked to talk to the residents on the safety measures that should be taken to address the pollution, health hazards and other issues affecting them.

Suruhanjaya Tenaga (ST) masih di peringkat akhir siasatan menyenaraikan kesalahan syarikat pembekal tenaga elektrik utama negara, Tenaga Nasional Berhad (TNB).

Siasatan itu berkaitan kesalahan dan ketidakpatuhan menyediakan perkhidmatan utiliti kepada pengguna.

Pengerusi ST Datuk Ir Ahmad Fauzi Hasan berkata,

jumlah penalti berkaitan perkara itu dikemas kini.

“Masih dalam proses (siasatan kesalahan dan penalti terhadap TNB). Saya tak mahu komen banyak, keterangan saya adalah sama seperti sebelum ini,” katanya.

Beliau enggan mengulas lanjut ketika ditanya antara kesalahan dilakukan syarikat utiliti berkenaan.

Minggu lalu Menteri Tenaga, Sains, Teknologi, Alam Sekitar dan Perubahan Iklim, Yeo Bee Yin dilaporkan berkata, TNB melakukan kesalahan dan kenaikan bil sebelum ini disebabkan ma-



salah teknikal syarikat itu.

“Mereka selesaikan 50 peratus aduan sebelum hari raya namun saya masih menunggu kemas kini keseluruhan aduan yang selesai.

“Memang mereka (TNB) ada lakukan kesalahan mengikut Akta Bekalan Elektrik 1990 dan akan dikenakan penalti oleh Suruhanjaya Tenaga.

“Sekarang ST masih mengumpul jumlah kesalahan yang dilakukan TNB dan jumlah kesalahan dan penalti akan diumumkan tidak lama lagi,” kata Yeo dalam laporan itu.

Powering young talent

THE financial aid given by Tenaga Nasional Bhd (TNB), under Yayasan Tenaga Nasional (YTN), to deserving scholars may seem like an annual agenda, but for some of its recipients, it is the decisive factor for them to continue their studies.

Growing up, G. Mahesan, 18, from Ipoh, Perak always wondered how his family would fund his tertiary education.

With this question constantly lingering in his mind, he makes it a point to seek out financial opportunities and work hard so that he will qualify for a scholarship.

When he broke the news of securing the YTN scholarship for a four-year civil engineering degree at Universiti Tenaga Nasional (Uniten), his family, especially his mother, was speechless but relieved.

"My parents only earn enough to make a living. My two brothers are still in school. I never knew where the funds for my studies would come from but I knew I wanted to study and make something of myself," said Mahesan, adding that lack of funds should not be an obstacle to higher education.

"I have been independent since I was 12 when I attended Maktab Rendah Sains MARA, Pasir Salak, a boarding school in Perak.

"I want my brothers to be proud of me and look up to me as an inspiration for them to strive even harder," he said, adding that he is eager to serve in TNB after graduation, as it is an ideal place to learn and grow.

His mother, S. Sarala Devi said she could not be more proud of her son.

"My son has been away since Form One and has just spent the past few months with us. He is my eldest son and I want the best for him but we are a middle income family and are grateful for the scholarship.

"He will be away again for the next five years, in pursuit of his interest."

Fellow scholarship recipient Siti Husna Anuar, 18, does not want to be a financial burden to her father, a police officer, and her mother, who works at the Inland Revenue Board.

"I have studied hard and applied for four scholarships. With help from YTN, I will pursue a degree in electrical power engineering," said Siti Husna.

It is also a double joy for Siti Husna as she is one of 20 scholarship recipients to pursue a degree overseas.

She will begin her foundation year at INTEC Education College before leaving for Australia.

"I was speechless when I read the congratulatory message from YTN. My parents wanted me to become a doctor but I am interested in engineering.

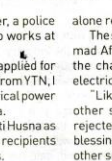

After I attended TNB's Nurturing Future Leaders programme, which aims to tap the talents of bright students with a keen interest in the power and engineering sector, I am sure of my choice of studies.

"I do not qualify for TNB's My Brighter Future scholarship due to household income but the YTN scholarship is open for youth with excellent academic and co-curriculum background."

YTN director Datuk Dr Shaari Md Nor said: "This year, we offered 130 scholarships to last year's Sijil Peperiksaan Malaysia school-leavers who have excelled not only in academics but also in co-curriculum activities. Twenty recipients will pursue their studies overseas after finishing a one-year foundation course in Malaysia."

Selected overseas students will attend the A Levels, International Baccalaureate and Foundation programmes at preparatory centres in the country and they must achieve the required excellent results before being allowed to continue their studies abroad.

"Those selected to study at Uniten

will also have the opportunity to study abroad for one semester under the YTN mobility programme to gain exposure overseas.

"This scholarship comes with great responsibility for scholars to succeed in the academic field as well as develop leadership qualities and integrity. They must always be cognisant of changes so that TNB is always relevant in the eyes of the people," he said, adding that TNB is committed to developing human resource.

Meanwhile, TNB chief executive officer Amir Hamzah Azizan, said beginning last year, YTN has allocated RM10 million for 1,000 students from low-income

families to study Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics at seven universities including Malaysian Technical Universities Network under TNB's My Brighter Future scholarship.

Scholars receive RM10,000 a year for tuition fees and living allowances until they graduate.

"This year, we have increased the number of recipients from low-income families to 2,000 and extended the scholarship to those undergoing TVET programmes at polytechnics and community colleges.

"I hope this financial aid will be able to help the families cover the costs of their children's education," said Amir, adding that the applicants do not have to attend an interview. "The students are selected from the Unit Pusat Universiti database and priority is given to those registered with e-Kasih. This scholarship is a unique gesture to help poor students."

PETALING JAYA: Kim Loong Resources Bhd expects minimal impact from the fire at its palm oil mill in Kota Tinggi, which will resume full processing capacity by end of July or early August. In a filing with Bursa Malaysia, the company said that it has completed the assessment of financial impact caused by the fire at its Johor mill and expects net financial impact on the group to be minimal. It said that the mill is expected to resume about 70% processing capacity by end of June. The fire incident happened on June 9 caused damage to the processing equipment and temporarily halted operations of the mill.

Cost of using shopping bags

FOR MANY people, using shopping bags made out of fabric instead of plastic is a no-brainer. But what if you don't have any with you?

What is the next best alternative – paper bags, or even biodegradable plastic, or other alternatives made out of corn or sugar cane?

Environmentalists advocate for reusable bags, if you do, in fact, utilise them multiple times. Indeed, their production is more harmful to the environment than that of single-use bags.

The German Environment Agency also emphasises that regardless of the kind of bag, you should always use it repeatedly, so that the environment is spared the production of a new bag.

Biodegradable plastic bags may sound like a good fallback solution, but it would take far too long for them to

decompose in the great outdoors or your compost.

The necessary high temperatures can only be reached in green-waste facilities.

And there is another problem: biodegradable plastics are hard to distinguish from other plastics.

If such a bag is in your organic waste, many composting plants will remove it.

But if it finds its way into plastic recycling, it will disrupt the cycle there because it is not classic plastic. So it usually ends up in the regular bin.

Like plastic bags, paper bags are a single-use product and so not particularly environmentally friendly.

But they can be a good option in countries that offer paper recycling as long as the bag does not end up in the regular rubbish. – dpa

Caretakers refuse to comply

DBKL mulls legal action against 36 operators for failure to surrender community halls as directed

KUALA Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) is having a hard time getting back community halls from third party caretakers appointed during the previous Federal Government administration.

Kuala Lumpur mayor Datuk Nor Hisham Ahmad Dahlan said this was because some of the third party caretakers were affiliated with political parties and had refused to return the halls to DBKL's care.

He said 36 out of 203 buildings had yet to be surrendered despite DBKL sending out notices last year.

The notice was sent to leaders of residents associations, Rukun Tetangga sectors and non-governmental organisations to hand over their community halls and buildings, in a move to streamline and legalise the management.

Nor Hisham said the buildings were government assets and some had been mismanaged by the third parties.

"We will take legal action against them if they fail to respond to our final notice," he added.

There are a total of 331 community halls under DBKL's jurisdiction, of which 203 are managed by third parties including political parties, residents associations, NGOs, government agencies and joint management bodies.

DBKL has managed to take back 167 community halls.

According to the mayor, the halls in Seputeh and Bandar Tun Razak are among those that have not been returned.

"Their excuse for holding onto the halls is that they have spent a lot of their own money on the renovation of the buildings, so they feel they have rights to them.

"We will give them time to respond and if they still refuse we will take action as per the law," he

told *StarMetro*.

Meanwhile, a DBKL officer said Yayasan Ehsan Seputeh had asked to continue managing the Tun Abdul Ghafar Baba Complex in Jalan Kuchai Jaya 1, off Jalan Kuchai Lama.

The officer said the complex was built to replace a previous hall that was sitting on land formerly owned by DBKL in Taman Desa, which was later transferred to a private developer to build affordable homes.

The new hall was then rented out to a furniture company.

In the past, residents had voiced their unhappiness over the fact that it was not easy to rent the hall.

Attempts to get Yayasan Ehsan Seputeh for a comment were in vain.

StarMetro quoted the foundation's former chairman Datuk Mustapa Kamal Mohd Yusoff in a January report saying that he had relinquished his position with Ehsan Seputeh and that the NGO no

longer had a political affiliation.

When told that the government might take over the building, Mustapa said Yayasan Ehsan Seputeh should be compensated.

DBKL officers told *StarMetro* that some of the caretakers were also in the midst of suing City Hall for compensation over being forced to relinquish their rights to the halls.

Falling into disrepair

According to officers in charge of the Seputeh and Bandar Tun Razak DBKL branches, many of the community halls and buildings in Kuala Lumpur are falling into disrepair as the caretakers continue to delay handing over the building to the local government.

"If they (caretakers) continue to delay (surrendering the buildings), the halls are not being utilised and will rot," said an officer from the Seputeh DBKL branch who did not want to be named.

"There are many community

halls in Kuala Lumpur that are not being maintained and have become white elephants," he said, adding that the community was being denied the right to use the halls in the meantime.

It was reported that there were more than 100 community halls, structures and *pondok* built on government land.

The DBKL officers said the structures were meant for use by residents associations and Rukun Tetangga sectors in Kuala Lumpur, but many had been taken over by people who claimed affiliation to political parties.

The individuals then rented out the building or land to third parties for a profit, added the officers.

Kampung Malaysia Raya Residents Association (KMRRRA) chairman Mohd Zainuddin Amran said KMRRRA was asked to return its community hall to DBKL last year.

"We did because it was the right thing to do.

"While we are not affiliated to

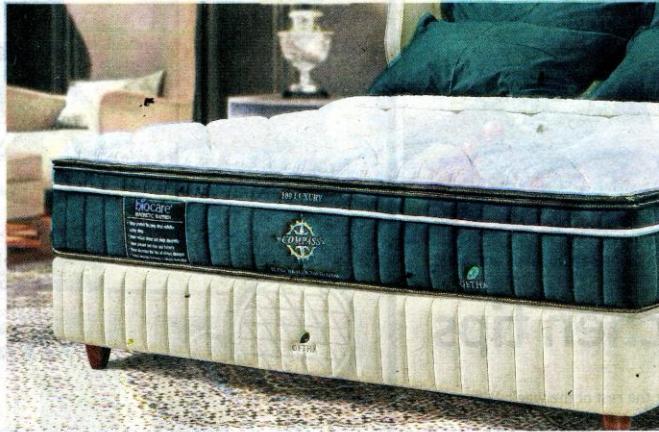

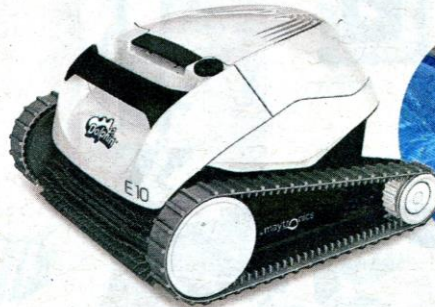

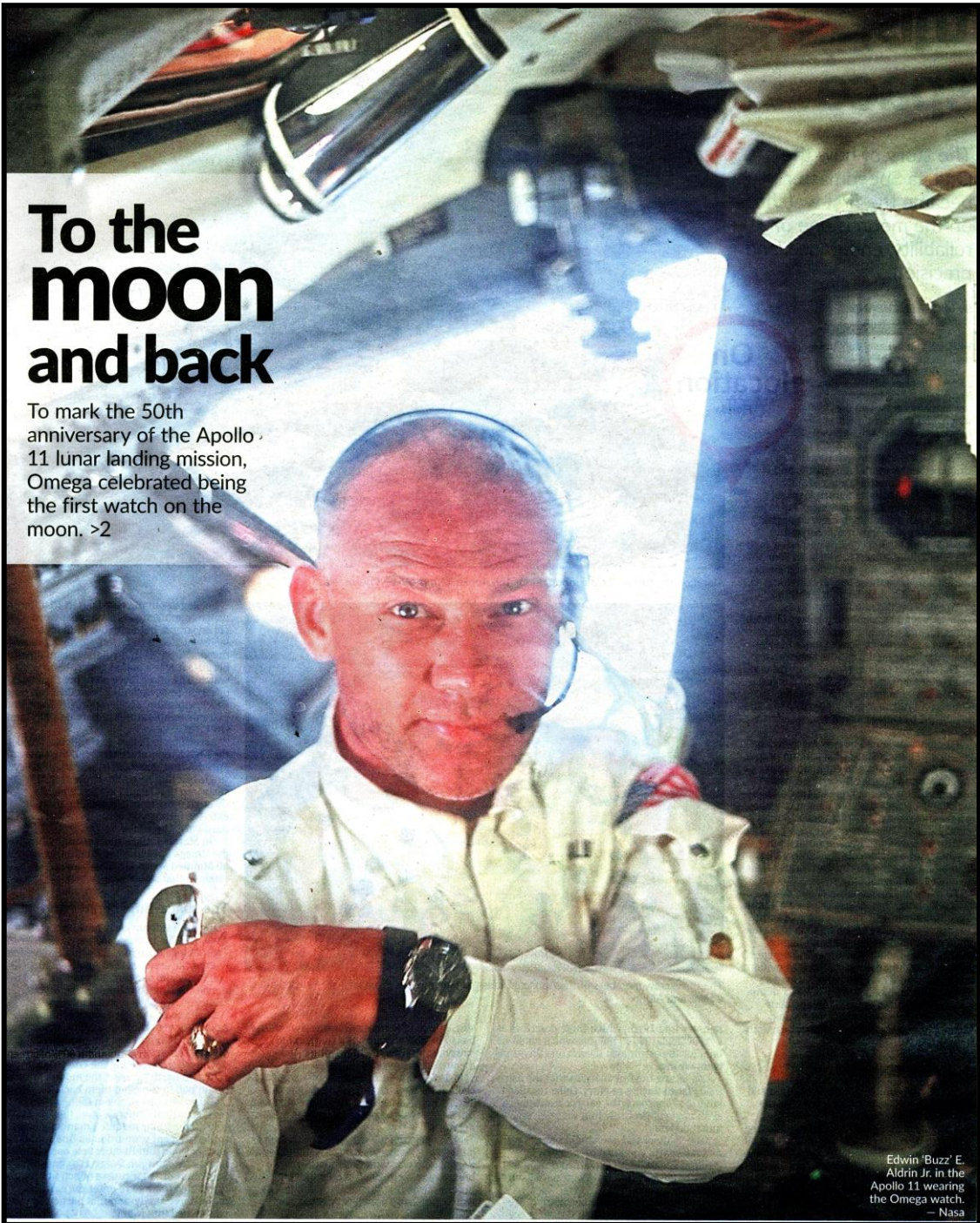

Watch this, space

The story of how the Omega Speedmaster became the first watch on the moon is one of reliability, endurance, and precision.

WOULD you believe, they put a man on the moon?
Yes, despite all those conspiracy theories out there that argue otherwise, humankind has actually set foot on the moon, and the first time that happened was 50 years ago, on 16 July, 1969, to be exact.

Five decades ago on that day, the United States' National Aeronautic and Space Association (Nasa) successfully launched the Apollo 11 Saturn V space vehicle from the Kennedy Space Centre in Florida, with a three-man crew comprising commander Neil Armstrong, command module pilot Michael Collins and lunar module pilot Edwin "Buzz" E. Aldrin Jr. Four days later, Armstrong made the first small step of a man on the moon, and in doing so, accomplished a giant leap for mankind.

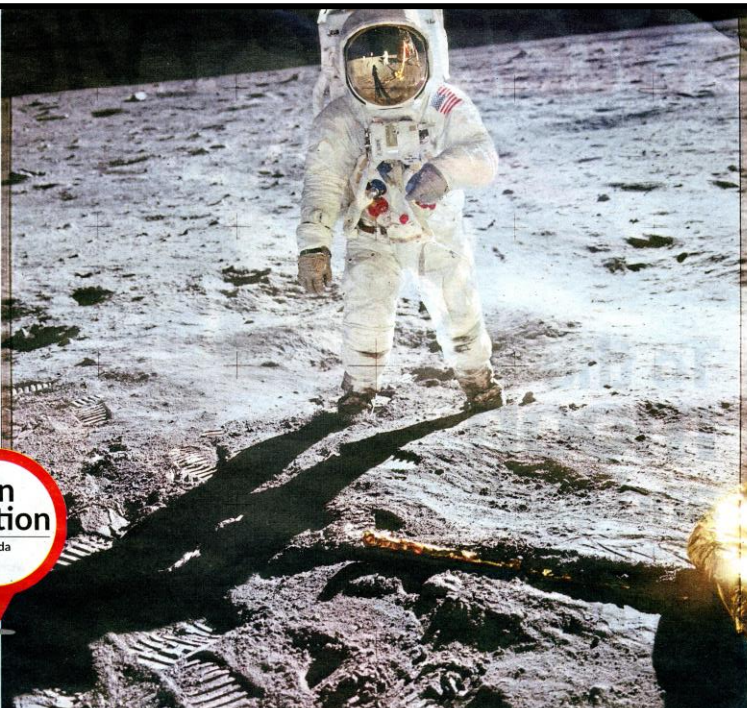
To celebrate the momentous occasion, Omega recently assembled a galaxy of celebrities, former astronauts and watch connoisseurs at the Kennedy Space Centre to celebrate the lunar landing's 50th anniversary. The Omega's Golden Moments event was held under a massive Saturn V rocket just like the one that launched Armstrong, Collins and Aldrin into legendary status, and headlined by Omega brand ambassador George Clooney.

Clooney was joined by two space-faring legends - Thomas Stafford, a veteran of four Nasa space missions and commander of Apollo 10; and Charles Duke, the capsule communicator for the crew of Apollo 11, who later became the 10th person to walk on the moon during 1972's Apollo 16 mission.

Also present were Nasa luminaries like former astronauts Nicole Stott, Terry Virts and Jean-François Clervoy, and former Nasa engineer Jim Ragan.
To mark the golden anniversary of the moon landing, Omega also released a 42mm Speedmaster in 18K Moonshine gold - an exclusive new alloy which offers a paler hue than traditional yellow gold and higher resistance to fading over time. The design is replete with lunar history as well as modern materials and a new movement: Omega's Master Chronometer Calibre 3861 - a manual-winding Omega Co-Axial escapement movement with Moonshine gold plated main plate and bridges, as well as burgundy markings.

Nasa certified

What's the connection between Nasa and Omega, you ask? Simple - Omega has the title of being the first ever watch on the moon, and also the honour of being the first watch to be certified "Flight Qualified for all Manned Space Missions" by Nasa.
But how do you decide what kind of watch can be brought to space and back? Any equipment that goes on Nasa's missions would need to withstand a multitude of extreme conditions, one of which is the

re-entry into Earth, which Duke describes as a "spectacular ride", but one which could be fatal for the astronauts if even one tiny thing went wrong.

Explaining the fine margins that the astronauts faced during re-entry, Duke recalled having to approach the earth's atmosphere at an angle of precisely four degrees, no more, no less.

"Too shallow and you would bounce off, and too sharp, you burn up at 3,000°F (around 1,650°C)," he explained during a series of talks by the Nasa luminaries during the day.

Upon entry, the capsule becomes a "fireball at over seven and a half Gs", so every

single piece of equipment inside that craft has to be able to withstand that kind of extreme situation. Including the watches on the astronauts' wrists.

In 1964, Nasa's programme office put the call out for a watch that could do just that, and former Nasa senior aerospace engineer Jim Ragan was the person in charge of finding it.

"The very first job they gave me (when I joined Nasa) was, 'We need a watch,'" recalls Ragan, who was with Nasa for 36 years before retiring in 1999. "And it quickly became clear that they didn't want just any watch, but also a watch they could time with."

So, Ragan put the word out to 10 different watch manufacturers for a wrist-worn chronograph, but only four of them sent over watches to be tested. However, one of the watches was immediately disqualified because it was a pocket watch, not a wrist watch. The other three were put through 10 different tests, including humidity, corrosion, shock, vibration, acceleration, pressure, and extreme temperatures of between 93°C and -18°C.

According to Ragan, two watches failed the high temperature tests, but the Omega Speedmaster managed to withstand every single test that he could throw at it. "I was surprised that I could get any watches through those tests ... It was the most extreme testing you could do to a piece of hardware," he added.

On March 1, 1965, Nasa officially declared the Omega Speedmaster "Flight Qualified for all Manned Space Missions", and it has retained that status ever since.

The space-time connection

If you're still not clear how important a good, reliable watch is in space, consider this - the Omega Speedmaster actually saved the lives of the astronauts of Apollo 13 in 1970. You know, the one that got made into a movie starring Tom Hanks, who says, "Houston, we have a problem".

Meant to be the third moon landing, Apollo 13 went through a catastrophic chain of events 56 hours into the mission that crippled the lunar module's life support and power systems, forcing the crew to devise a return to Earth by using the moon's gravitational pull to slingshot them back.

There was one problem though - with their electrical systems down, they had to rely on the lunar module's manually-controlled descent propulsion engine, and created 14-second mid-flight course corrections using astronaut Jim Swiggett's Omega Speedmaster. That course of action eventually enabled them to re-enter the earth's atmosphere safely, and that particular watch was etched into legend.

In a less stressful example of how a reliable watch is crucial in space, former astronaut Nicole Scott said her standard-issue Omega X33 watch was the only thing that kept her on track throughout the day during her two space missions with the space shuttle Discovery and Endeavour, and also on the International Space Station.

"Flying in space, there's this interesting idea of time in general. We're traveling at 17,500 miles an hour (28163.52 km/h) and we're going around the Earth every 90 minutes! We get 16 beautiful sunsets and sunrises every day," she recalled. "Since we're basically going through night and day 16 times a day, we have to work based on the time on our watches. My watch was the only thing that kept me to pace throughout the day."

But back to the Moonwatch. A year later, after Nasa gave the Speedmaster its seal of approval, astronaut Ed White became the first American to walk in space, and he was wearing a Speedmaster on his wrist. In fact, the Speedmaster was on each of NASA's manned missions, including those in the Mercury, Gemini and Apollo programmes.

By 1969, NASA had adopted the most recent versions of the Speedmaster, including the ST 105.012 and ST 145.012, the two models that were worn by the Apollo 11 astronauts during the mission.

Now, although Armstrong was the first man on the moon, Aldrin was the one who made the Omega Speedmaster the first watch on the moon, as Armstrong had left his watch in the lunar module.

So, at 03:15:16 UTC (Coordinated Universal Time) on July 21, 1969, Buzz Aldrin became the second man on the moon while wearing his watch on his wrist. Thus, the Omega Speedmaster became the first watch worn on the moon, and the legend of the Moonwatch was born.

Since that fateful day, the watch has returned to the moon for all of the other lunar landings, including Apollo 12 (1969), Apollo 14 (1971), Apollo 15 (1971), Apollo 16 (1972) and Apollo 17 (1972). In total, only 12 men have ever walked on the moon and the Speedmaster has been there for every step. What was a giant leap for mankind, was also a moment that cemented a watch's place in history.



Kanada bincang ambil semula sisa plastik

12 KILLED IN CHINA QUAKE

More than 4,000 people relocated, large number of structures damaged

BEIJING

THE toll from a strong 6.0-magnitude earthquake in southwest China rose to 12 dead and 134 injured yesterday as rescuers pulled bodies and survivors from wrecked buildings.

More than 4,000 people were relocated as a large number of structures were damaged after the quake struck on Monday near Yibin in Sichuan province.

State broadcaster CCTV showed footage of rescuers bring-

ing a survivor out of the rubble of a building on a stretcher overnight. Other images showed a woman being helped out of another collapsed structure.

Images from Changning county showed an electricity pole knocked down on the roof of a building, a hole in a brick home and broken windows on the street.

Cracks appeared on roads and a highway connecting Yibin and Xuyong county was closed. Mud and rock slipped from the side of a hill, blocking a road and wrapping around a truck.

More than 10,000 rooms within an undisclosed number of buildings were moderately damaged while 12 collapsed, according to Yibin authorities. The homes of more than 4,000 families were damaged in Gong county.

The possibility of thunder and showers over the next two days

could complicate the rescue efforts, according to Xinhua.

An early warning alarm system was triggered in the provincial capital Chengdu about one minute before the earthquake struck, Xinhua said.

Nine people died in Changning county and three others in Qixian county, the Yibin city government said in its Weibo account, up from an initial death toll of six overnight.

Rescuers pulled six bodies and seven survivors from buildings, it said. Xinhua said more than 50 people were being treated in two hospitals. **AFP**

China quake death toll climbs to 12

BEIJING: The toll from a strong 6.0-magnitude earthquake in south-west China rose to 12 dead and 134 injured as rescuers pulled bodies and survivors from wrecked buildings.

More than 4,000 people were relocated as dozens of structures were damaged or collapsed following late Monday's earthquake outside Yibin in Sichuan province, the city government said yesterday.

State broadcaster CCTV showed footage of rescuers bringing a survivor out of the rubble of a building on a stretcher overnight.

Other images showed a woman being helped out of another collapsed structure.

Images from Changning County showed an electricity pole knocked down on the roof of a building, a hole in a brick home and broken windows on the street.

Cracks appeared in several highways and a major highway connecting Yibin and Xuyong County was closed, according to the official Xinhua news agency.

Xinhua reported overnight that a hotel close to the epicentre collapsed, but there was no immediate word of any casualties.

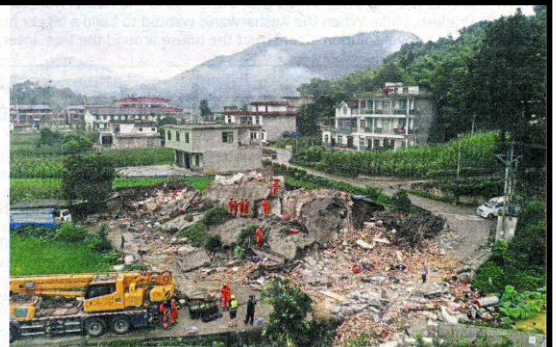
An early warning alarm system was triggered in the provincial capital Chengdu about one minute before the earthquake struck, Xinhua said.

A three-second headstart before an earthquake strikes can prevent 14% of casualties, Xinhua said.

Nine people died in Changning County and three others in Qixian County, the Yibin city government said on its Twitter-like Weibo account, up from an initial death toll of six overnight.

Rescuers pulled six bodies and seven survivors from buildings, it added, with more than 50 people were being treated in two hospitals.

Over 500 firefighters were dispatched to the scene. Rescue personnel were also sent with 5,000 tents, 10,000 folding cots and other emergency supplies, Xinhua reported. — AFP

Tsunami warning in Japan

TOKYO: A strong and shallow earthquake struck Japan's northwest coast around Niigata prefecture yesterday, triggering a small tsunami, shaking buildings and cutting power to around 9,000 buildings.

The magnitude 6.4 quake, according to the US Geological Survey, lasted for 20 seconds and damage included a landslide that struck a road, according to public broadcaster NHK.

There were no initial reports of fatalities or fires.

NHK said tsunamis of several centimetres struck parts of the Niigata coast, and authorities maintained a 0.2-1.0m tsunami warning for the region.

A tsunami of up to 1m could cause flooding and damage in low-lying coastal areas although much of Japan's coastline is guarded by sea walls.

"We'll work closely with local authorities to provide disaster measures including lifesaving and rescue operations and have instructed officials to provide information in a timely manner," Chief Cabinet Secretary Yoshihide Suga said at a media briefing.

12 killed, 134 injured as strong quakes hit China

BEIJING/SHANGHAI: The death toll from two strong earthquakes in China rose to 12 yesterday, with 134 people injured, state media said, adding that rescuers pulled some survivors from rubble in a part of the country that often suffers strong tremors.

The quakes, roughly 30 minutes apart, hit the southwestern province of Sichuan late on Monday, with shaking felt in key regional cities, such as the provincial capital of Chengdu and the metropolis of Chongqing.

People rushed into the streets and cracks were left in some buildings by the quakes, pictures posted on the social media accounts of state media showed.

Rescuers pulled some people out of rubble alive near the epicenter, in a largely rural area, state television added.

A quake of magnitude 5.9 was followed by a smaller one of 5.2 magnitude, both at a depth of 10km and centred near Changning county, the US Geological

Survey said.

There were several aftershocks, the China Earthquake Administration said, while the US quake agency recorded one of magnitude 5.2 yesterday.

More than 500 firefighters have been dispatched to the scene.

Rescue personnel were also sent with 5,000 tents, 10,000 folding cots and other emergency supplies, official news agency Xinhua reported. - Agencies

SWEDISH teenage activist, 16-year-old Greta Thunberg, was recently announced as the winner of a global human rights award. She was said to have inspired millions of school students to protest for climate change with a growing movement demanding action on the issue. By starting a weekly vigil outside the Parliament of Sweden last year, her action has spread far and wide globally. “You have to fight for what you think is right,” she was quoted as saying. Something that not many students of her age (even older) would be too concerned with especially if it is going to reduce their chances of scoring the “perfect” ace. In fact, they have just missed the chance to be educated in the “real” sense of the word.

More shockingly, she is bold enough to state, “The blatant injustice we need to fight against is that people in the global south (the emphasis is mine) are the ones who are and will be most affected by climate change, while they are the least responsible for causing it.” A fact of life that has been known by most but very few have the guts to tell it as it is!

I vividly recall at one high level United Nations forum on sustainable development where a Swedish minister admitted that someone who wants to live like the Swedes, must have the resource equivalent of three planets (for that matter it is similar for most of Western Europe; for North America, the number is five).

So Greta has done the world a great favour by explaining what the minister really meant then. And the wide ranging implications of the “blatant injustice” that she was referring to. Kudos! It has been long time waiting.

Now that the Pandora’s box has been cracked opened, the issues at hand are easier to analyse.

In a nutshell, as Greta succinctly put it, the case rotates around some “blatant (historical) injustices” that took place, and never put right, be it at the global or even local level, depending on the circumstances.

While many recognise that such disparities are acute, they are unable or unwilling to press on, never mind the victims of the injustices themselves. So the issues continue to revolve, despite that the “answers” are staring at our faces. That is, like all “injustices” there must be some measure to “neutralise” them through compensation, repatriation and anything of that order.

It is a question of rights for humanity which have been taken for granted (intentionally or otherwise).

To recognise this with the Ambassador of Conscience Award, from the well-respected organisation, Amnesty International is

singularly significant. She and her “Fridays for Future” (3F) global movement join the likes of Nelson Mandela, the all-time hero for humanity, in creating hope for the future.

Aptly, the secretary-general of Amnesty International, Kumi Naidoo, remarked: “We are humbled and inspired by the determination with which youth activities across the world are challenging us all to confront the realities of the climate crisis.”

Indeed, the 3F has captured the imagination of school-going youth causing authorities to recognise their leadership role when adults are too busy with their own agenda. Carbon emissions continued to hit a new record high last year despite the many global promises made with a stern warning by the UN in October. Yet to no avail.

In other words, the younger generation must now be welcome to take the centrestage like how it was done in 1992 when a Canadian teenage activist, Severn Cullis-Suzuki, stunned (and even shamed) the largely adult and professional audience at the UN Conference on Environment and Development in Rio.

This was what she said: “Coming here today, I have no hidden agenda. I am fighting for my future. Losing my future is not like losing an election or a few points on the stock market.

“I am here to speak for all generations to come.”

She then asked: “Did you have to worry about all these things when you were my age? All this is happening before our eyes and yet we act as if we have all the time we want and all the solutions. I’m only a child and I don’t have the solutions. I don’t - I want you to realise, neither do you.”

This was more than 25 years ago, and today nothing much has changed. Time is running out and we still do not have all the solutions as the situations get worse.

It is only timely that Greta picks up the baton and presses forward to create the future that they want. The generations who have messed up the planet, must now pause and listen; and lend the utmost support to these young energetic children who are determined to correct the “blatant injustice” which has been denied for so long to the people of the global south.

No doubt this is the “answer” towards a lasting sustainable future that lies at the hands of the schoolgoing teenagers.
