Zahid's motive of disregarding Adham's denial is nothing but a show of vengeance for the government. To him, there is nothing just right about the government-of-the-day under prime minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin.

He will continue to raise eyebrows, with his litany of accusations against Muhyiddin and the government, just like what is being done by his political company, including opposition leader and PKR president, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim, and former Umno president and prime minister, Datuk Seri Najib Razak.

They had ganged up in their attempts to remove Muhyiddin and replace Anwar as prime minister last year, but failed. Latest - the pole-making company, Mestron Holdings Bhd, had clarified it did not have the ministry's approval or a clearance letter to purchase or distribute the vaccines. Instead, it clarified that its intention is to explore and venture into the vaccine distribution business by partnering with a China-based company.

The steel pole maker also refuted news reports citing Mestron as saying it had received a letter of permission from the Health Ministry to begin the negotiation process. This is because only the ministry has the authority to manage access to and the purchase of the vaccines.

While the public are being sufficiently briefed on vaccine rollout, Zahid should just keep his silence. There is no time for politicking as the people and the economy have been badly hit by the pandemic. Already, a comprehensive communication plan on the vaccine for the public has already been carried out.

Science, Technology and Innovation Minister, Khairy Jamaluddin, also an Umno leader, had said the vaccine confidence must be built first to
