

1.4 million persons did not complete vaccine registration

A total of 1.4 million individuals who had registered to receive the vaccine under the National Covid-19 Immunisation Programme are urged to complete their registration to allow appointment dates to be scheduled, says Science, Technology and Innovation Minister Khairy Jamaluddin Abu Bakar.

The minister was informed that the individual involved only confirmed the name and identity card number when registering through the MySejahtera application.

He noted that however, they did not answer questions related to health assessment, apart from not entering their respective addresses, which resulted in incomplete registration.

“The individuals involved will receive notifications via short message system (SMS) sent to their mobile phones to complete the registration, starting this afternoon.

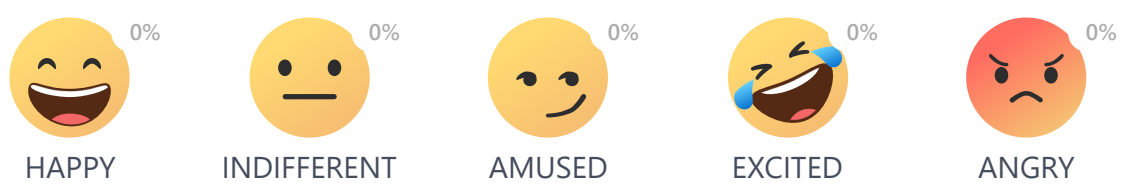
“It is important for people to fill in their address, as we will make an appointment at the vaccination dispensing centres (PPV) near the address entered during registration,” he said at a joint press conference with Health Minister Datuk Seri Dr Adham Baba on the latest updates of the National Covid-19 Immunisation Programme today.

Khairy added that the ministry will not take the address from individual’s identity card, as many do not use or live in the same address shown in their identity card. ↑

Therefore, the minister said he hopes that the individuals involved would be able to complete their registration immediately.

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
