HE second round of the opt-in programme for the AstraZeneca Covid-19 vaccine will be open for bookings from May 23 to 26 for senior citizens residing here and in four citizens.

in four states, National Covid-19 Immunisation Programme Coordinating Minister Khairy Jamaluddin said the slots were open to senior cit-izens aged above 60 in Kuala Lumpur, Selangor, Penang, Johor and Sarawak.

Khairy, in a post on Twitter yes-terday, said the federal territory

"Bookings (are available) via (the http://vaksincovid.gov.my) website and community clinic outreach programmes conducted by district health clinics," said Khairy, who is also science, technology and innovation minister. Earlier, during the weekly press
