Vehicle Type Approval (VTA) permit from the Road Transport Department for the EV Two Wheelers as the VTA is important for MNAE's SmartSwap programme," Khoo pointed out.

MNAE was established in 2016 and has been awarded research grants by the Science, Technology and Innovation Ministry for the development of next-generation battery technology.
