SMK St Teresa gets extra RM50k for new building KUCHING: SMK St Teresa has received another RM50,000 to purchase furniture and teaching \* aid for its new school building. Democratic Action Party's (DAP) Bandar Kuching MP Dr Kelvin Yii said that the sum was on top of the RM 100,000 allocated by his office and the Minister of Science, Technology and Innovation during the Pakatan Harapan (PH) administration. Founded in 1885, the school was named by Reverend Father Jackson MHM after a renowned Carmelite sister. He arrived in Borneo in 1881 upon the invitation of Rajah Charles Brooke to establish Catholic mission schools in Kuching and Kanowit.
