Selangor's Dubai Expo 2020 potential investment value target exceeds expectations at nearly RM1 bln

SHAH ALAM, May 20 — The state government's delegation managed to record a potential investment value of RM960.7 million, surpassing its initial target of RM500 million during the Selangor Week at Expo 2020 Dubai.

The Selangor Week which ran from March 6 until March 12 also recorded 158 business matchings and 92 potential business collaborations involving large and important sectors.
